STATE GOVERNMENT (UCA 36-12-13(2)(b))

Enactment of this bill would increase revenue to the Commerce Service Fund by \$3,500 in FY 2014 and by \$5,900 in FY 2015. Costs to the Department of Commerce to implement the provisions of the bill would be \$700 annually. Spending from the Commerce Service Fund affests annual transfers to the General Fund.

An estimated 50 individuals will apply for the \$70 license established in the bill resulting in a cumulative cost of \$3,500. An estimated 50 individual will renew in year two at a cost of \$47 for an additional cumulative cost of about \$2,400.
