# 2 What services are provided by the funding increase?

JR4-2-404(4)(c)(ii)

The Bureau of Health Promotion will be responsible for promoting the use of community health workers in medically underserved communities, developing programs to educate the community on health systems to reduce dependence on emergency rooms for primary and routine are, create an advisory board to receive public input, establish a pilot program for the placement of community health workers in medically underserved populations via mini grants, and report annually to the legislature.

The purpose of the Community Health Worker Program is to promote the use of community health workers in medically underserved communities, educate the community on available health systems to reduce dependence on emergency rooms for primary and routine are, solicit public input via the establishment of an advisory board, and fund community organizations to place community health workers in medically underserved populations via a mini-grant pilot program.

3 What are the expected outcomes of the new or expanded program and how will the public benefit?

JR4-2-404(4)(c)(iii)

Increased promotion and use of Community Health Workers will decrease inappropriate use of health care resources, such as emergency rooms, for primary and routine care.

### 4 How will the bill be implemented and what resources are available to achieve the expected outcomes? JR4-2-404(4)(c)(iv)

In partnership with the required advisory committee, the Bureau of Health Promotion will develop a plan and resources to promote the importance of the work of community health workers in underserved communities, develop materials for community health workers to use in educating the public about appropriate use of health care resources, and create guidelines for and implement a competitive mini-grant program to fund community agencies in placing community health workers in medically underserved communities.

### 5 How will the proposed agency activities cause the expected outcomes and public benefit in 3?

Proposed activities are expected to increase the number of community health workers who are placed in and working to serve medically underserved communities. Community health workers can help clients navigate the health care system and seek appropriate care for their primary and routine needs.
