SHORT TITLE: Utah Department of Agriculture and Food Amendments

SPONSOR: Hinkins, D. (Mathis, J. Sub.)

2013 GENERAL SESSION

STATE GOVERNMENT (UCA 36-12-13(2)(b))

Enacting this bill may cost the Department of Agriculture and Food \$9,200 beginning in FY 2014, of which \$6,100 comes from dedicated credits revenue generated by this bill, and \$3,100 comes from the General Fund ongoing. The bill allows the department to use up to 10% (\$200,000) of the appropriation to the Invasive Species Mitigation Account for department administration, project planning, monitoring, or implementation.

Enactment of this bill likely will not result in direct, measurable costs for local governments.

DIRECT EXPENDITURES BY UTAH RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES (UCA 36-12-13(2)(d))

The estimated total costs on Utah businesses associated with the implementation of this bill's requirements for testing and sale of the raw milk is \$5,600. Local property owners allowing swine hunting on their property will pay \$500 for inspection by the Department of Agriculture and Food.
