## STATE GOVERNMENT (UCA 36-12-13(2)(b))

This bill could generate \$122,000 annually to the General Fund Restricted Commerce Service Account Public Utility Regulation Fee revenue for the Public Service Commission beginning in FY 2015. This would cover the cost of one FTE to conduct studies related to electrical transmission facilities.

## LOCAL GOVERNMENTS (UCA 36-12-13(2)(c))

Local governments that are clients of companies that are subject to the Public Utility Regulation Fee that provide services of gas, water, electricity, and landline phones will pay \$0.05 more annually.

## DIRECT EXPENDITURES BY UTAH RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES (UCA 36-12-13(2)(d))

About 2.6 million clients of companies that are subject to the Public Utility Regulation Fee that provide services of gas, water, electricity, and landline phones will pay \$0.05 more annually to generate a total of \$122,000.
