## STATE GOVERNMENT (UCA 36-12-13(2)(b))

This bill appropriates \$750,000 one-time from the General Fund in FY 2015 to the Division of Air Quality (DAQ). The money will be spent as follows: \$500,000 as reimbursement for the conversion of wood burning stoves (grant program) and \$250,000 for a public education campaign.
