SHORT TITLE: Emergency Telephone Service Law Amendments

## STATE GOVERNMENT (UCA 36-12-13(2)(b))

Enactment of this bill could increase revenue from the Statewide Unified E-911 Emergency Services program by \$682,900 annually and decrease revenue to the Poison Control Center by \$1,872,200 annually.

## LOCAL GOVERNMENTS (UCA 36-12-13(2)(c))

Local revenue may increase by \$976,100 annually from the change in the Emergency Telecommunications Charge.

## DIRECT EXPENDITURES BY UTAH RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES (UCA 36-12-13(2)(d))

Individuals and businesses may see an increase in tax liability of \$1,659,000 from the changes to the Emergency Services taxes and a decrease in tax liability of \$1,872,200 from a change in the Poison Control Center charge.
