The bill may cost and generate revenue in dedicated credits for the Department of Health of \$9,400 in FY 2014, \$31,300 in FY 2015, and \$31,300 in FY 2016 to certify about 100 certified community health workers annually. Ongoing costs in FY 2017 will be \$22,500.
