Enactment of this legislation could decrease revenues to the General Fund by \$2,500 beginning in FY 2016, from reduced fines paid by candidates for state, legislative, school board, or judge offices who fail to report campaign contributions within the statutory time period.

Approximately 70 candidates for state, legislative, school board, or judge offices who fail to report certain campaign contributions within the statutory time period could pay lower fine amounts of about \$36 each for a total of \$2,500.
