Enactment of this legislation could cost the Governor's Office \$3,055,000 from the General Fund and \$5,000 from Dedicated Credits one-time in FY 2016 for the following: \$3,000,000 to pass-through to counties to administer the primary election; \$40,000 to purchase equipment and software for Internet voting; and \$20,000 for training of election officials, administration costs, and voter outreach.
