**State Government**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(b)

Enactment of this legislation may create revenues of \$82,300 in FY 2018 and \$522,300 in FY 2019 for the newly-created Medicaid Preferred Drug List Restricted Account.

Enactment of this legislation may reduce Department of Health expenditures for prescription drugs in the Medicaid program by \$200,000 one-time from the General Fund and \$500,000 from federal funds in FY 2017 then by \$1,300,000 ongoing from the General Fund and \$3,000,000 from federal funds in FY 2018. By FY 2022 ongoing General Fund savings may be \$3,700,000 and federal fund savings of \$8,600,000. Enactment of the legislation may reduce the cost of some drugs used at the Department of Human Services' Utah State Developmental Center by \$5,800 ongoing from the General Fund beginning in FY 2017. Forty percent of the savings from a prior fiscal year must be deposited in the newly created Medicaid Preferred Drug List Restricted Account. This may result in appropriations from the General Fund of \$82,300 in FY 2018, \$522,300 in FY 2019, and \$1,482,300 in FY 2023.
