Enactment of this legislation likely will not materially impact state revenue.

Enactment of this legislation could reduce expenditures for the Lieutenant Governor's Office by \$11,800 from the General Fund beginning in FY 2016, as the office would no longer be required to verify approximately 110,000 signatures. Cost savings would be in election years only, but are annualized at \$5,900 beginning in FY 2017.

Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could reduce county expenditures state-wide by \$8,600 beginning in FY 2016, as counties would no longer be required to verify approximately 80,000 signatures. Cost savings would be in election years only. Counties may also avoid expenditures related to primary elections, principally due to accommodating fewer total voters as unaffiliated voters would no longer be eligible to participate in partisan primary elections.

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct, measurable expenditures by Utah residents or businesses.
