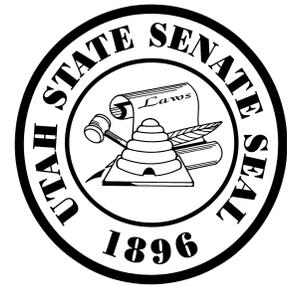

Enactment of this legislation likely will not materially impact state revenue.

Enactment of this legislation could cost a total of \$123,400 with \$117,500 ongoing from the General Fund and \$5,900 from federal funds, beginning in FY 2017 to address an additional estimated 130 child protective orders. The breakdown is as follows: 1. Courts - \$37,700 for additional judge and clerk time in these cases; 2. Guardian ad Litem - \$32,300 for additional attorney representation; and, 3. Human Services - \$53,400 for additional child protective service investigations related to these cases (including the \$5,900 in federal funds).
