Enactment of this legislation could generate about \$208,000 ongoing in General Fund revenue beginning in FY 2017.

Enactment of this bill could cost the Courts and the Guardian ad Litem \$249,700 ongoing from the General Fund beginning in FY 2017. The breakdown of costs is as follows: 1. Courts - \$150,600 for additional court proceedings/time, and 2. Guardian ad Litem - \$99,100 for court time and investigations.

About 1,040 parties could pay about \$200 on average in court filing fees for a total of \$208,000 annually. Certain petitioners could pay \$5,000 and attorney fees to the opposing party due to provisions in the bill.
