## Local Government

Enactment of this legislation may decrease local government costs because the bill instructs peace officers and other authorized individuals to issue citations rather than delivering individuals charged with class B or C misdemeanors to a custodial facility under specified circumstances. Actual savings realized will vary with the number of infractions and length of the pre-trial stay.
