State Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(b)

Enactment of this bill could increase dedicated credit revenue from fines by \$1,000 annually. Enactment of this bill could also reduce year-end transfers to the General Fund from the Commerce Service Fund by \$3,200 annually.

Enactment of this bill could cost the Department of Commerce \$3,200 from the Commerce Service Fund annually for investigations and follow-up on potential violations related to individuals not checking the controlled substance database. Spending from the Commerce Service Fund impacts year-end transfers to the General Fund.
