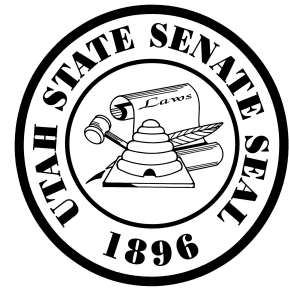

Enactment of this bill appropriates \$671,700 from the Education Fund to the State Board of Education to fund the Effective Teachers in High Poverty Schools Incentive Program outlined in the bill and to provide for program administration costs. The State Board of Education estimates the cost of the program to increase to \$952,800 in the second year of the program.
