Enactment of this bill may create additional workload and associated ongoing costs of \$29,800 from the General Fund beginning in FY 2017 for the Courts (\$24,000 judge/clerk time and jury expenses) and Guardian ad Litem (\$5,800 for attorney representation). To the extent there are forgone kinship adoptions under this bill, enactment of this bill could cost the Department of Human Services about \$5,900 per instance (\$4,600 in General Fund and \$1,300 in federal funds) for additional child placement processing costs.
