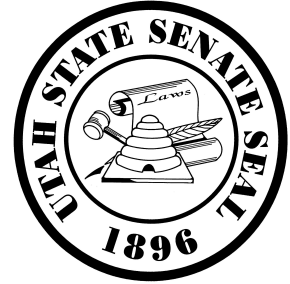

Purpose: To provide a state wide and regional crisis intervention program, a Crisis Intervention Team Utah Program Advisory Council, certifications for peace officers and support for these from DSAMH.

Services: There is no additional funding noted in the bill, however we have attached a fiscal note in order for DSAMH to support state wide and regional CIT UPAC efforts.

Expected Outcome: A defined state wide program will be established along with support for regional programs and an advisory council. Certification of peace officers is already being performed, but less than 50% of the state is currently participating. The public will benefit from a more consistent CIT standards and the responsive and thoughtful law enforcement engagement that comes with CIT.

Implementations and Resources: We will implement the bill following the outline in the bill. We will need slight increases in time to support and create the Crisis Intervention Team Utah Program Advisory Council and implement the state wide and regional crisis intervention team programs.
