Enactment of this legislation could cost the Department of Human Services (DHS) \$800 (\$700 General Fund and \$100 federal funds) beginning in FY 2018 to train and provide technical assistance to Department of Health (DOH) employees searching DHS databases to determine if individuals applying for an emergency medical services license have a history of child or vulnerable adult abuse or neglect. The legislation could also cost DOH \$500 General Fund beginning in FY 2018 for those same employees to complete the training and receive technical assistance on two percent of searches. Both departments indicated they can absorb these costs in their existing budgets.
