Enactment of this legislation will increase revenue for the State Board of Education by requiring them to charge a fee to local education agencies for the use of the statewide student information system. At an annual fee of \$6.88 per student, the State Board of Education will generate \$1,138,100 ongoing beginning in FY 2018 which will cover the cost to operate and maintain the statewide student information system.

Enactment of this legislation may cost \$1,138,100 ongoing from fee revenue generated from local education agencies beginning in FY 2018 to the State Board of Education to operate and maintain the statewide student information system. The fee revenue will cover expenditures currently made by the State Board of Education for the statewide student information system from the Education Fund.

Local Government UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation may cost local education agencies (LEAs) \$1,138,100 total statewide annually in fees for the use of the statewide student information system. Cost impacts will vary by LEA based on whether or not the LEA chooses to use the statewide student information system and, if so, the size of the LEA with each LEA paying a fee of about \$6.88 per student.
