This bill appropriates \$13,000,000, including \$4,000,000 from the General Fund for FY 2017, plus \$5,030,241,000, including \$965,684,600 from the General Fund for FY 2018. These appropriations support the operations and capital acquisitions of state government, including expendable funds and accounts. It transfers another \$5,517,400 in FY 2018 from the General Fund into other funds and accounts.
