This bill appropriates (\$9,330,700), including (\$19,957,200) from the General Fund for FY 2017, plus \$5,091,045,500, including \$946,824,800 from the General Fund for FY 2018. These appropriations support the operations and capital acquisitions of state government, including expendable funds and accounts. It transfers another \$5,517,400 in FY 2018 from the General Fund into other funds and accounts.
