UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

To the extent that individuals avoid infractions under this bill, local governments could lose \$25 in fine revenue per instance beginning in FY 2018. To the extent that individuals are required to obtain additional emissions inspection certificates under this bill, certain counties could collect a maximum of \$30/instance beginning in FY 2018.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

To the extent that individuals avoid infractions under this bill, they could save \$25 in fines per instance. To the extent that individuals are required to obtain additional safety or emissions inspections certificate under this bill, it could cost \$7-\$20 for safety inspections and no more than \$30 for emissions inspections certificates per instance. Businesses performing these services could collect \$7-\$20 for the safety inspections fee.
