**Local Government**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this bill could lead to an unknown number of new cases beginning in FY 2018, resulting in both expenditures for local justice courts to process the cases, and revenue to local courts from fines of up to \$110 per infraction conviction. Enactment of this bill could cost local law enforcement agencies for additional court appearances.

**Individuals & Businesses**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation could lead to fines of up to \$110 for individuals who are convicted of an infraction.

**Notes on Notes**
