To the extent the Attorney General's Office chooses to implement the open file policy outlined in this legislation, it could incur up to \$383,100 in ongoing costs from the General Fund beginning in FY 2018 to disclose the required information. Costs could include a 1/2 FTE experienced attorney and one FTE paralegal for the Medicaid Control Fraud Unit; a 1/2 FTE experienced attorney and one FTE paralegal for the White Collar and Commercial Enforcement Division; and a 1/2 FTE paralegal for the Justice Division.
