Performance Note Report

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Agency: Department of Workforce Services

Funding For:

New Services or Benefit

Public Benefit:

Purpose: Help eligible participants receive a high school diploma and to achieve higher levels of employment and benefits.

Services: Provide incentive to an intermediary community foundation to help eligible participants achieve the purpose of the bill.

Expected Outcome: The expected outcomes seem to be associated with the eligible participants success in education and employment status and benefits. With this bill, that seems to be outside the control of the Department of Workforce Services, because the department will merely be administering a pass-through to an intermediary party as incentives for achieving certain threshold results that were determined by a board not fully in control of the department. Because the department would not directly facilitate the participants' achievements, the department recommends soliciting the intermediary for these outcomes.

Implementations and Resources: Using the direction and appropriations of the bill to establish a board, staff the board, and act as the pass-through agency to provide results-based payments as established by the board.

How: Ideally this would result in participants receiving more high school diplomas and better employment and benefits than they would have achieved without the program.
