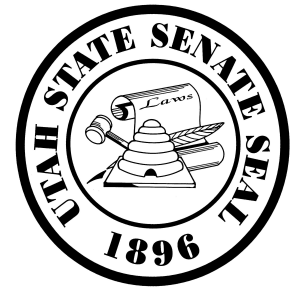

Enactment of this legislation likely will not materially impact state revenue.

Enactment of this bill could cost the Governor's Office \$17,000 one-time from the General Fund in FY 2018 for programming costs to electronically process voter registration applications. It could also save the Driver License Division \$1,300 ongoing General Fund beginning in FY 2019 in avoided application processing costs.
