UCA 36-12-13(2)(b)

Should the dissolution of the identified justice courts occur, the transfer of the attendant workload could increase State revenue by \$8,100 ongoing to the General Fund beginning FY 2019.

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### Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Local governments could lose \$8,100 revenue annually and could reduce operating costs beginning in FY 2019 from workload that may be transferred to the State resulting from the closure of the justice courts and the transfer of legal cases to the State district courts.
