## Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)
Local governments could lose $\$ 8,100$ revenue annually and could reduce operating costs beginning in FY 2019 from workload that mayl be transferred to the State resulting from the closure of the justice courts and the transfer of legal cases to the State district courts.

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)
Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct, measurable expenditures by Utah residents or businesses.
