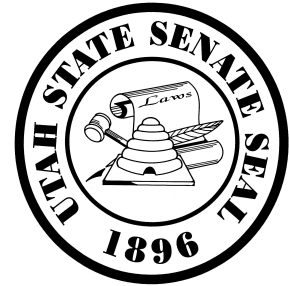

Enactment of this bill facilitates collection of one-time revenue to the Education Fund resulting from federal tax reform of an estimated \$36 million one-time in FY 2019, \$27 million one-time in FY 2020, and \$17 million one-time in FY 2021. Total estimated collections over 8 years is an estimated \$296 million.

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct, measurable costs for local governments.

**Individuals & Businesses**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this bill clarifies and facilitates collection of state taxes due from corporations with repatriated assets resulting from federal tax reform estimated at \$36 million in FY 2019 and \$27 million in FY 2020 and \$17 million in FY 2021.

**Regulatory Impact**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(e)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

**Notes on Notes**

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
