Enactment of this legislation may cost the Utah Department of Health (DOH) \$6,700 from the General Fund in FY 2019 and \$32,000 ongoing from the General Fund in FY 2020 to oversee public education student vision screenings as outlined in the bill. The Department of Workforce Services (DWS) currently oversees student vision clinics. The ongoing cost for DOH is offset by an ongoing savings in DWS of a like amount, namely (\$32,200) ongoing from the General Fund beginning in FY 2020.

Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation requires local education agencies to conduct student vision screenings as outlined. The State Board of Education estimates the nurse staffing cost at approximately \$905 per school, plus the cost of vision screening materials estimated at \$102 per school.

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct expenditures from tax or fee changes for Utah residents and businesses.

Notes on Notes
