UCA 36-12-13(2)(c) Local Government

Enactment of this legislation could decrease ongoing revenue to local governments by \$25 per infraction, up to an annual aggregate of approximately \$30,000. Should all individuals who receive an infraction properly install a front license plate within a 30 day period, local governments could lose another approximately \$30,000 in ongoing revenue.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation could decrease fines for individuals who fail to install a front license plate by \$25 per infraction, up to an annual aggregate of approximately \$30,000. Should all individuals who receive an infraction properly install a front license plate within a 30 day period, individuals could avoid paying the fine.

Regulatory Impact

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.
