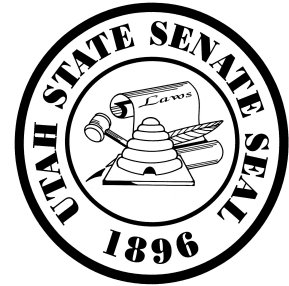

Enactment of this legislation could cost county governments between \$227,500 and \$479,000 in aggregate ongoing costs and up to approximately \$435,000 in aggregate one-time costs related to implementation of ranked choice voting, including software, personnel, and education and outreach costs.

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct expenditures from tax or fee changes for Utah residents and businesses.
