Enactment of this legislation could cost the Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health \$6,500 one-time in FY 2021 and \$13,800 one-time in FY 2022 from the General Fund to staff the newly-created Mental Health Crisis Intervention Council, provide per diem and travel reimbursements to certain council members, develop the crisis intervention team training standards program described in the legislation, and present the program to stakeholder groups. The division has indicated it can absorb these costs in its existing budget.
