Enactment of this legislation may reduce ongoing dedicated credits to the Department of Health by \$12,000 beginning in FY 2022. Additionally, enactment of this legislation may reduce ongoing revenue beginning in FY 2022 to the Department of Public Safety by \$300 dedicated credits and \$400 General Fund.

Enactment of this legislation may cost the Department of Health from dedicated credits \$500 one-time in FY 2021 for staff time to change rules, and reduce costs from dedicated credits by (\$12,000) ongoing beginning in FY 2022 for processing 115 fewer new licenses and 160 fewer license renewals. The Department of Health has indicated that it can absorb the one-time cost. Additionally, enactment of this legislation may reduce ongoing expenditures beginning in FY 2022 for the Department of Public Safety by \$400 General Fund and \$300 dedicated credits for processing 20 fewer background checks.

Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

To the extent that local governments pay licenses and background checks for emergency medical dispatchers, they will save \$45 per new licensee and \$30 per license renewed as well as \$33.25 and \$20 per duplicative background check.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Emergency medical dispatchers or their employers annually will no longer pay \$45 each for 115 new licenses and \$30 each for 160 license renewals nor \$33.25 and \$20 for duplicative background checks beginning in FY 2022.

Regulatory Impact

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation could result in a small reduction in the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.
