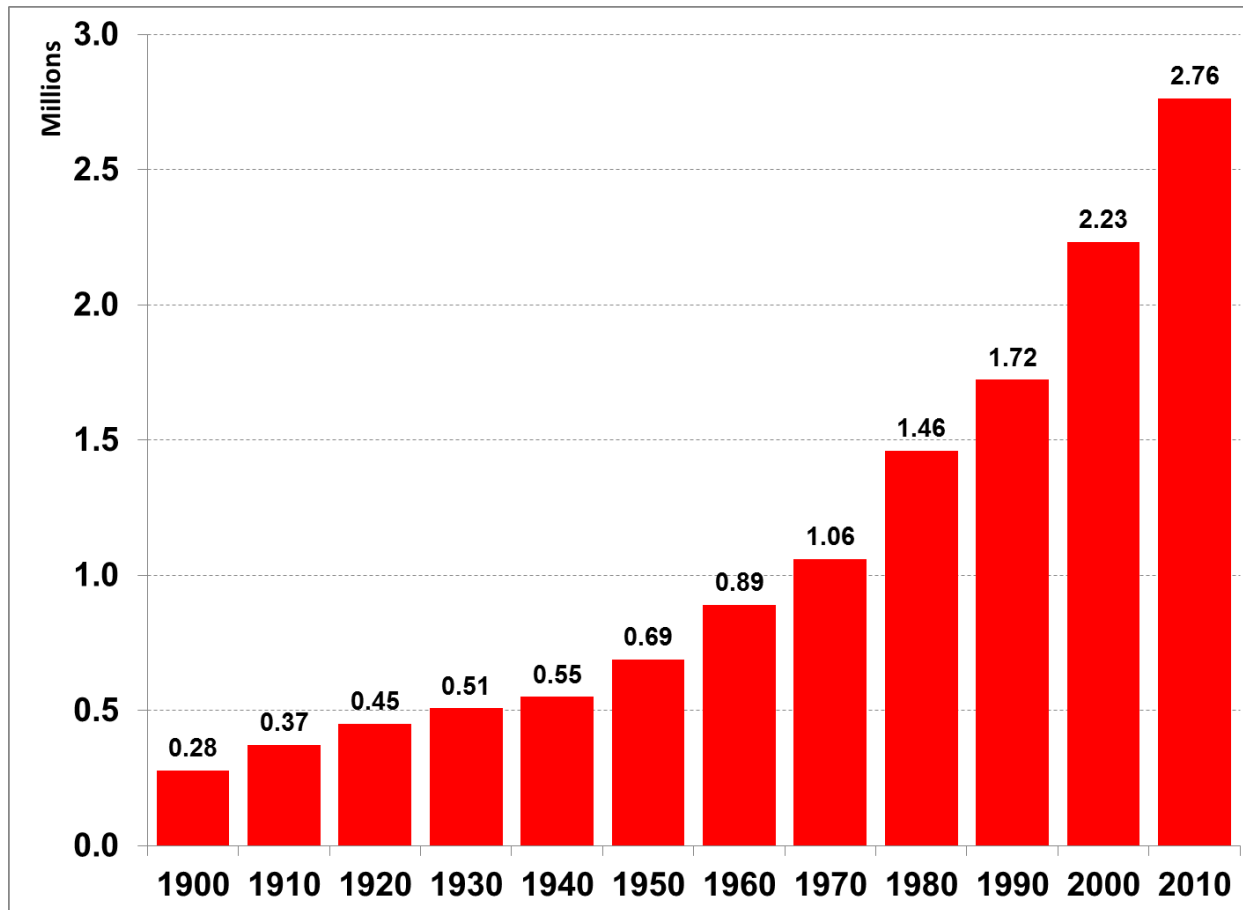

# Utah Total Population, 1900 to 2010

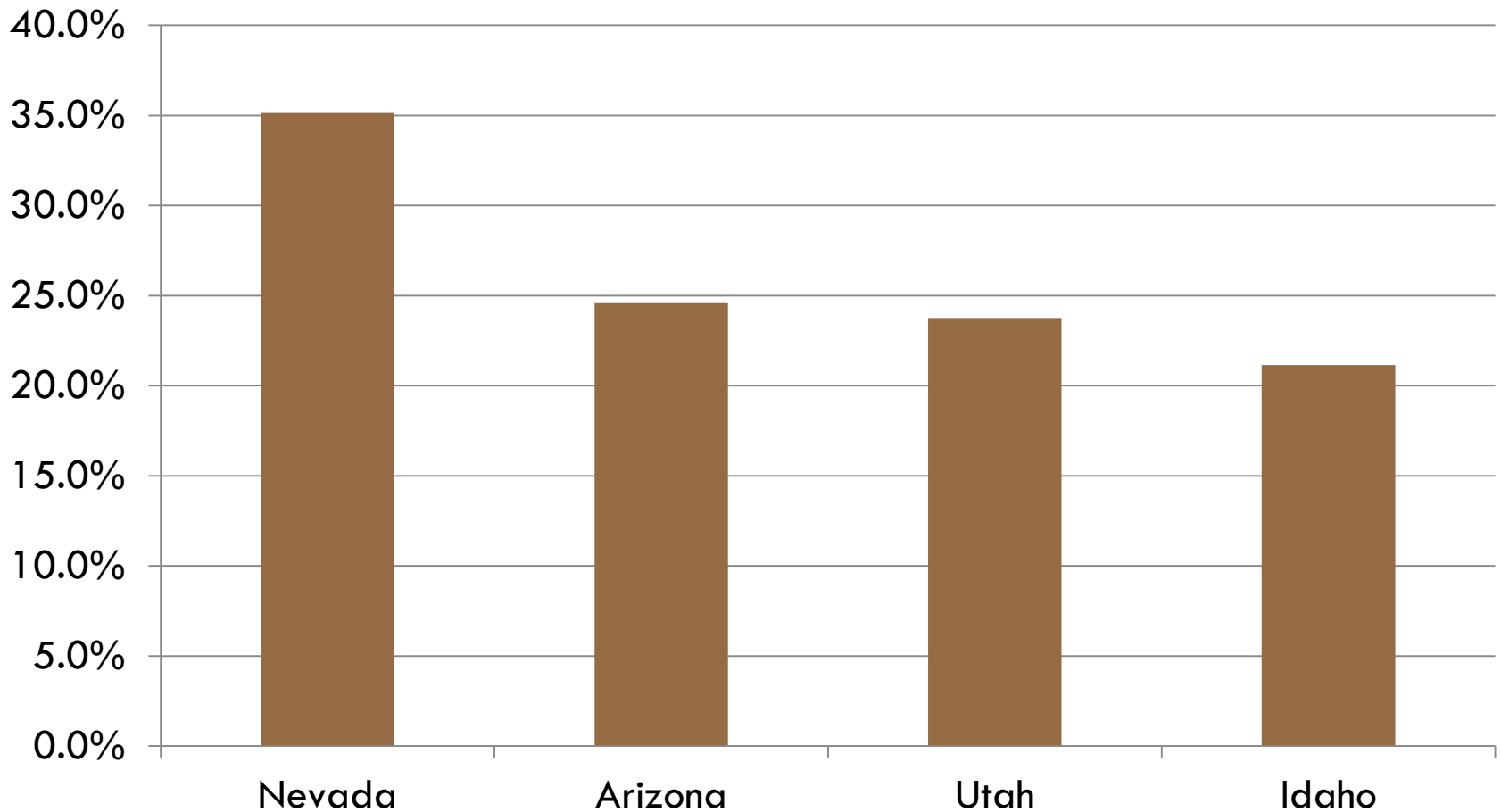

# Population Changes 2000-2010

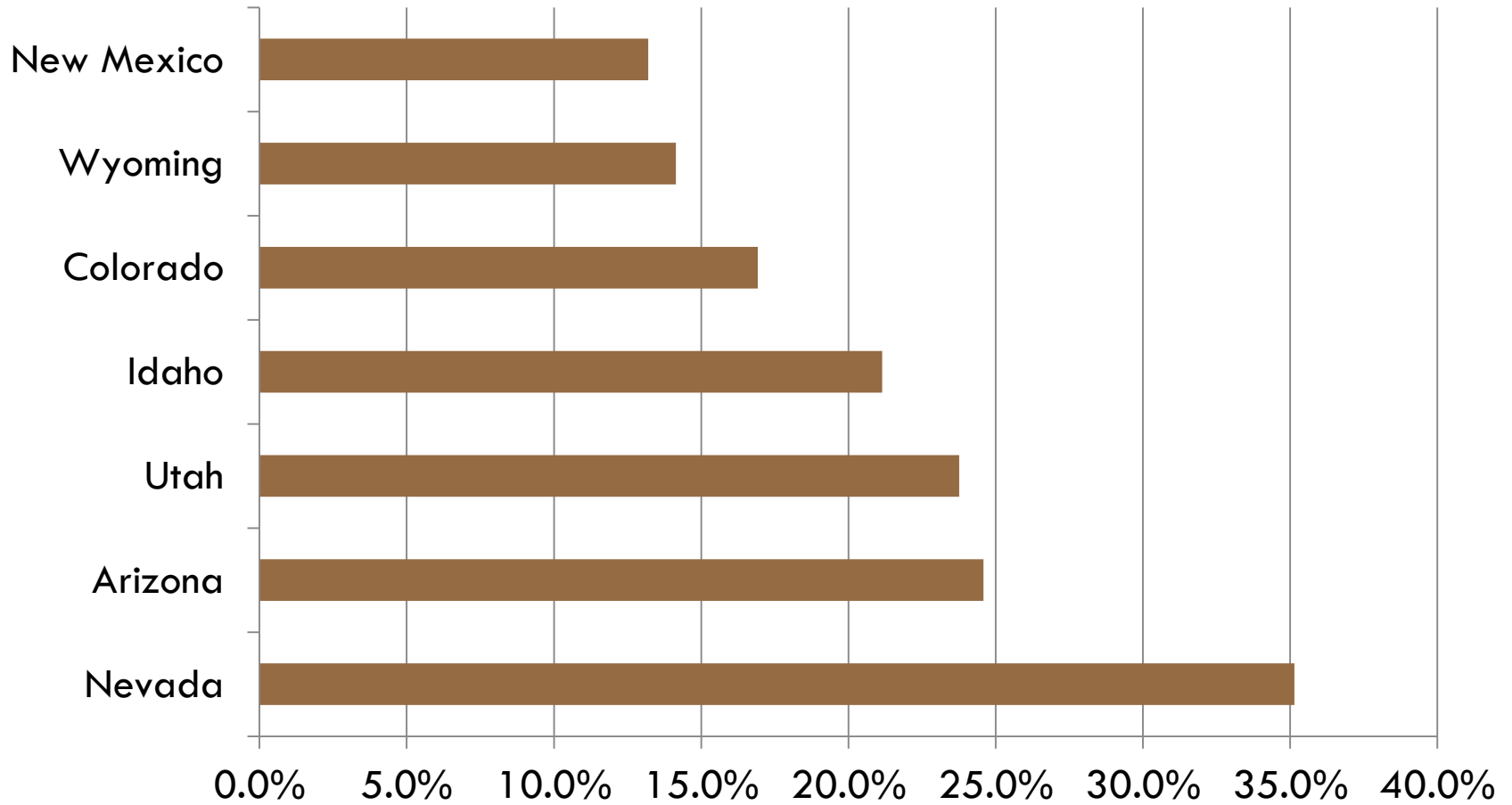
- Utah was the third fastest growing state (by percent) in the nation
  - An increase of 23.8%
  - From 2,233,169 to 2,763,885
  - 530,716 new Utahns
- Utah 13th fastest growing state (by numbers)
  - Faster growth than: New York, Pennsylvania, Illinois, and Ohio
- Latest Census numbers - April 1, 2010 to July 1, 2011
  - Utah population 2,817,222 - an increase of 1.9%
  - Utah still third fastest growing state (only behind Washington D.C. and Texas)

# Growth of All Mountain States 2000-2010



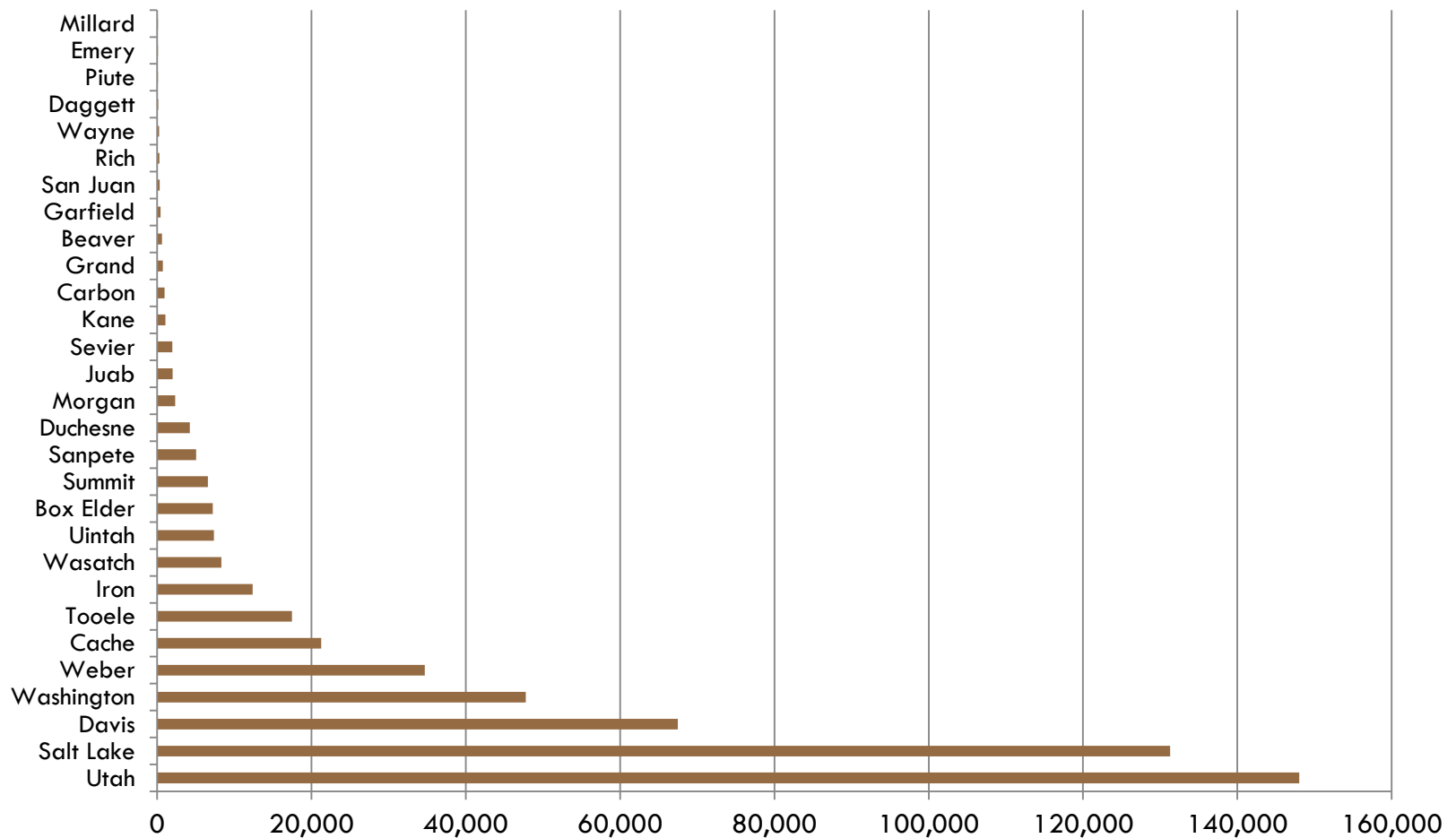

# Mountain States Population Growth 2000-2010

- Mountain states combined growth: from 17.3 million to 21.1 million - 3.8 million
- This is greater than the growth of two regions:
  - Midwest 2.5 million
  - Northeast 1.7 million

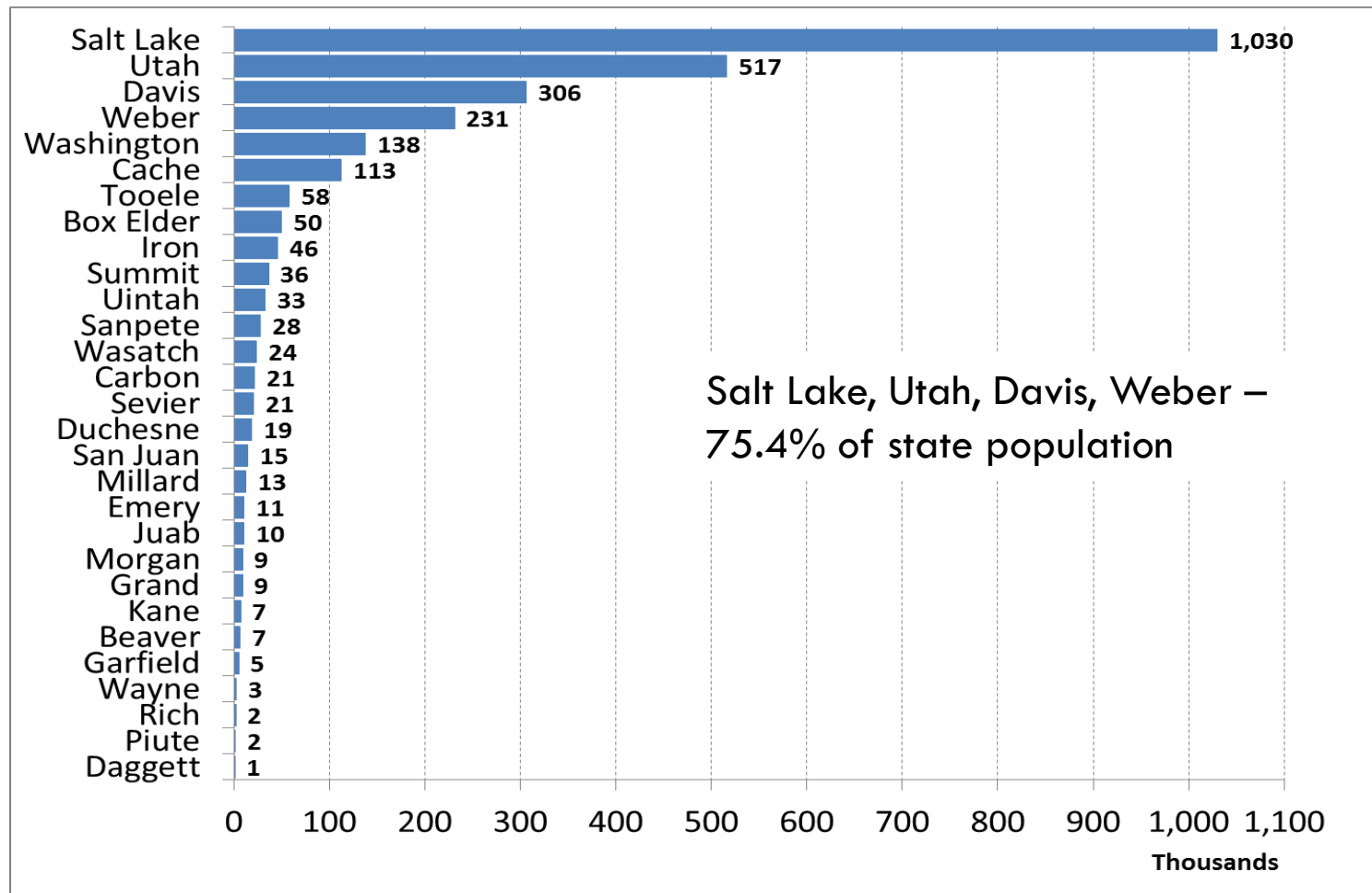

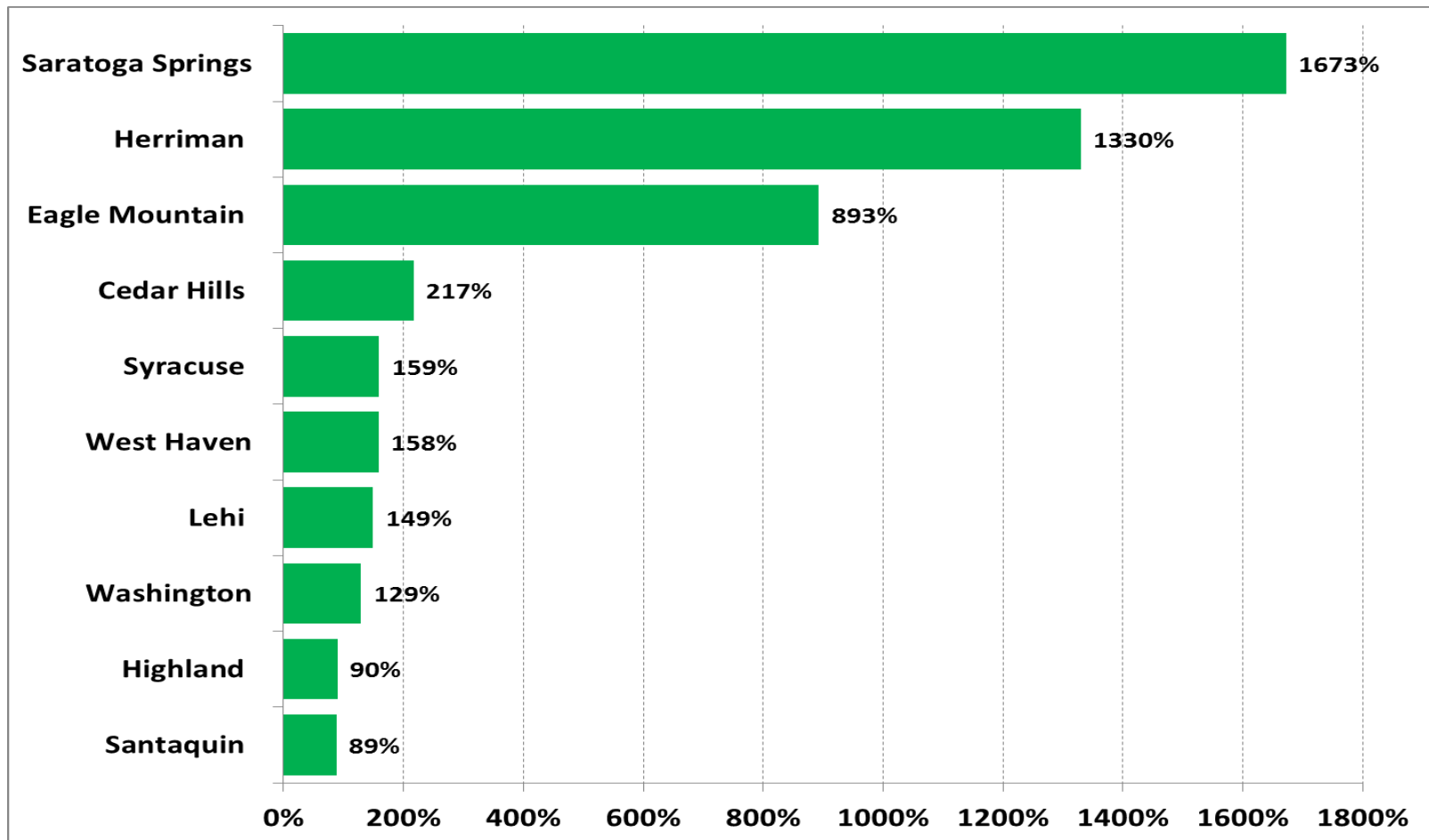

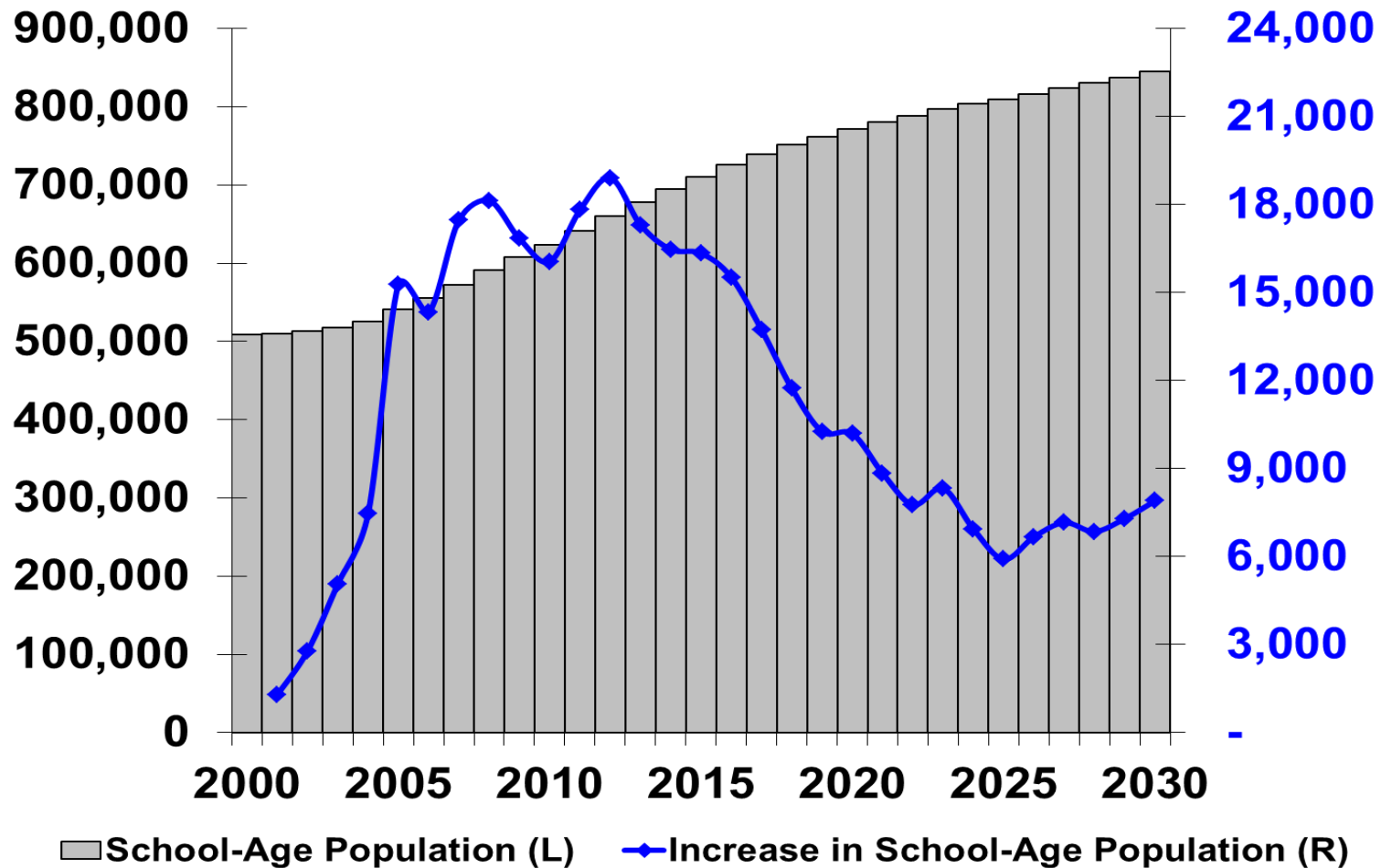
# Race and Ethnicity

- Of Utah's population of 2,763,885:
  - 80.4% are white, non-Hispanic
    - decline from 85.3% in 2000
  
- Utah's racial make-up is:
  - White - 86.1%
  - Asian - 2.0%
  - American Indian, Alaska Native - 1.2%
  - Black or African American - 1.1%
  - Native Hawaiian, Other Pacific Islander - 0.9%
  - Two or More Races - 2.7%

# Race and Ethnicity, (cont.)

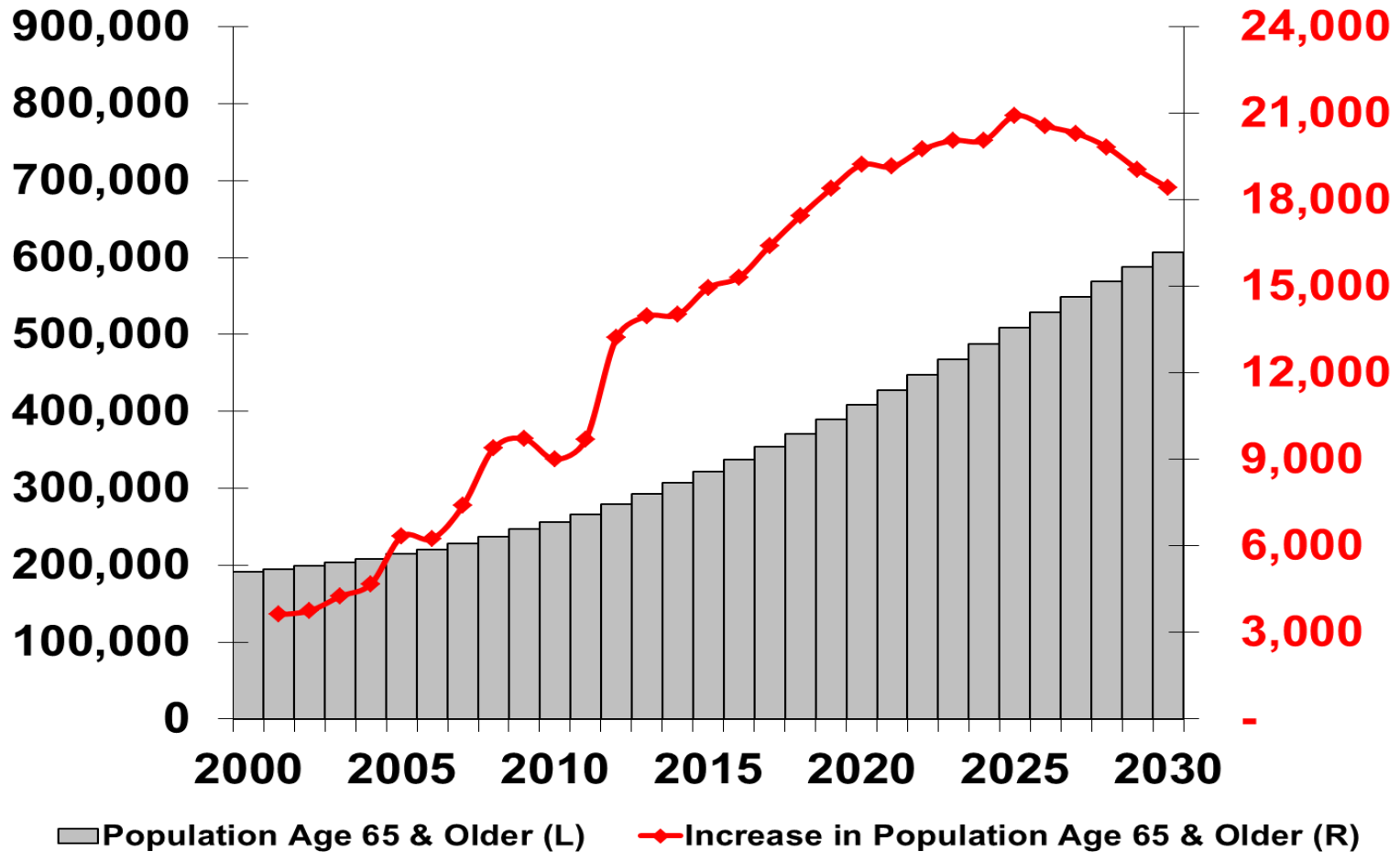
- Utah Ethnicity
  - Hispanic or Latino population
    - 358,340 Hispanics
    - 13% of state population
      - 9% in 2000
      - 5% in 1990
- Hispanics by County and Percent of State Population
  - Salt Lake - 176,015 or 49.1%
  - Utah - 55,793 or 15%
  - Weber - 38,711 or 11%
  - Davis - 25,753 or 7%
- Big Four Counties
  - 75% of state population
  - 83% of Hispanic population

# Summary:

## This is Not Your Father's Utah

- Third fastest growing state in nation by percent and 13th fastest growing state by number
- Trend of increasing urbanization along Wasatch Front (and Back) continues
  - Washington County a significant exception
- Utah's fastest growing cities reflect the rapid growth of northern Utah and southwestern Salt Lake counties
- Utah's rapid increase of Hispanics is significantly changing state ethnic make-up
- Utah is experiencing two age-related trends that will significantly affect the state over the next few decades:
  - Slowing growth rates of school-age population
  - Increasing growth rates of 65 and older population
