MOTION: Rep. Tyler moved to amend the bill as follows:

1. Page 7, Line 23: After "Education;" delete "or"
2. Page 7, Line 24: After "Veterinarians" delete "." and insert "; or"
3. Page 7, Line 24: After Line 24 insert:
"(c) a general acute hospital."

The motion passed unanimously with Reps. Baca and Way absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Bryson moved to amend the bill as follows:

1. Page 8, Line 5: After "provide" insert "written"
2. Page 8, Line 6-8: Delete "The court may waive the notice requirement in the interest of justice for good cause shown, if the prosecutor is not unfairly prejudiced by the lack of timely notice."

Rep. Tyler requested that the motion be divided.

The first part of amendment passed unanimously.

The second part of the amendment failed with Reps. Arrington, Baca, Nielsen, Way, and Tyler voting in opposition.

MOTION: Rep. Rowan moved that the bill be amended as follows:

1. Page 7, Line 2-3: Delete "(d) obtain from the purchaser a legible fingerprint, preferably of the right thumb, which shall be placed on the certificate next to the purchaser's signature."

The motion failed with Reps. Arent, Arrington, Baca, Bryson, Johnson, Nielsen, Way, Curtis, and Tyler voting in opposition.

MOTION: Rep. Arrington moved to pass the bill out favorably.
The motion passed unanimously.

The motion passed with Rep. Rowan voting in opposition.

H.B. 270 **Child Support for Adult Children**

Rep. Swallow introduced the bill.

MOTION: Rep. Arent moved that the bill be amended as follows:

1. Page 4, Line 6: After "child" delete "such as" insert "or on the adult child's behalf including"

2. Page 6, Lines 25-31: Delete lines 25 through 31 and insert "(3) In the case of an incapacitated adult child, any amount that the incapacitated adult child can contribute to his or her support may be considered in the determination of child support and may be used to justify a reduction in the amount of support ordered, except that in the case of orders involving multiple children, the reduction shall not be greater than the effect of reducing the total number of children by one in the child support table calculation."

3. Page 7, Line 1: Delete the line

The motion passed unanimously with Reps. Baca, Way, and Tyler absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Rowan moved that the bill be passed out favorably.
The motion passed with Rep. Baca voting in opposition.
Rep. Tyler was absent for the vote.

H.B. 306 **Capitol Sentencing Amendments**

MOTION: Rep. Bryson moved to amend the bill as follows:

1. Page 1, Line 1: At the beginning of Line 1:
Delete "Capitol" and insert "Capital"
