H.B. 18 Computers for Highway Patrol - Rep. Gerry Adair

MOTION: Rep. Chard moved to amend the bill as follows:

1. Page 1, Line 8: After "FIELD TROOPERS;" insert "APPROPRIATING \$164,744 FOR TECHNOLOGY SUPPORT PERSONNEL;"

2. Page 1, Line 19: After Line 19, insert:

"Section 2. **Appropriation.**

There is appropriated for fiscal year 1998-99 from the General Fund to the Utah Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety \$164,744 to fund the following technology support personnel:

(1) one program director;

(2) one programmer/analyst III; and

(3) one technical support specialist II."

3. Page 1, Line 20: After "Section" delete "2." and insert "3."

The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Buckner, Rep. Hendrickson, and Rep. Swallow absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Seitz moved to pass the bill out favorably as amended. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Swallow absent for the vote.
