 ", except for inmates who correction officials determine are physically or mentally disabled, or pose a danger to the public, so that they are unable to engage in these activities"

4. Page 3, Line 21: After "applicant" insert "or permit holder"
5. Page 3, Line 23: After "applicant" insert "or permit holder"
6. Page 3, Line 24: After "denial" insert ", suspension, or revocation"
7. Page 3, Line 26: After "an applicant" insert "or permit holder" and after "denial" insert ", suspension, or revocation" and after "the applicant" insert "or permit holder"
8. Page 3, Line 31: After "denial," insert "suspension, or revocation,"

The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Hogue, Rep. Saunders, and Rep. Seitz absent for the vote.
