Vice Chair Allen called the meeting to order at 8:11 a.m.

MOTION: Representative Murray moved that the minutes of the January 27, 1998 meeting be approved. The motion passed unanimously with Representatives Bush, Adair, Davis, Dillree, Nelson and Ure absent for the vote.

Representative Beverly Evans distributed a handout on the portion of “Utah Tomorrow” dealing with Infrastructure issues and requested that committee members review it and offer any recommendations they might have.

**H.B. 33 COMMUNITY RESPONSIVENESS REQUIREMENTS OF
 UTAH DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION
 - Representative Ralph Becker**

Representative Becker explained the bill to the committee.

Renee Tanner, Salt Lake City; Linda Plouzek, Parent and Teachers Association; and Janice Gygi, League of Women Voters, spoke in support of the bill.

MOTION: Representative Ure moved that the committee move to the next item on the agenda.

SUBSTITUTE MOTION: Representative Dillree moved to amend the bill as follows:

1. Page 1, Lines 9-10: Delete "; REQUIRING WRITTEN RESPONSES, RECORDKEEPING, AND REPORTING"
2. Page 2, Line 3: After "municipalities to" and insert "help"
3. Page 2, Line 21: After "municipalities to" and insert "help"
4. Page 2, Lines 24-31: Delete lines 24 through 31
5. Page 3, Lines 1-3: Delete lines 1 through 3
6. Page 3, Line 4: Reinstate "(4)" and delete "(6)"

Representative Davis requested that the proposed amendments of Representative Dillree be divided.

The committee voted on amendments 2 and 3. The motion passed unanimously with Representative Ure absent for the vote. Representative Bush was excused.

The committee voted on amendments 1, 4, 5 and 6. The motion passed with Representatives Beck, Becker, King and Siddoway voting no. Representative Ure was absent for the vote. Representative Bush was excused.

MOTION: Representative Knudson moved that the bill be passed out favorably as amended. The motion passed with Representatives Allen, Nelson and Siddoway voting no.

Representative Becker presented a letter from "Concerned Citizens About 2nd Avenue" (copy attached).

H.B. 34 DINOSAUR DIAMOND PREHISTORIC HIGHWAY DESIGNATION

- Representative Jack A. Seitz

Representative Seitz explained the bill to the committee and proposed amendments to the bill.

MOTION: Representative Dillree moved that the bill be amended as follows:

1. Page 1, Line 7: Delete the period and insert "; AND PROVIDING A COORDINATION CLAUSE."
2. Page 1, Line 27: After line 27 insert:
"Section 2. **Coordination clause.**
If this bill and H.B. 202, Transportation Code Recodification, both pass during the 1998 General Session, it is the intent of the Legislature that the section in this bill be renumbered to conform to the renumbering in H.B. 202."

The motion passed unanimously with Representatives Davis and Knudson absent for the vote.

Dean Reeder, Community and Economic Development spoke in support of the bill.

Clint Topham, Utah Department of Transportation, expressed some concerns with the bill.

MOTION: Representative Dillree moved that the bill be amended as follows:

1. Page 1, Line 15: After "north to" insert "the frontage road of"
2. Page 1, Line 16: After "west on" insert "the frontage road of"

The motion passed unanimously with Representatives Davis and Knudson absent for the vote.

MOTION: Representative Dillree moved that the bill be passed out favorably as amended. The motion passed unanimously with Representatives Davis and Knudson absent for the vote.

MOTION: Representative King moved that the bill be placed on the Consent Calendar. The motion passed unanimously with Representatives Davis and Knudson absent for the vote.

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**S.B. 6 ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES OF UNINSURED
MOTOR VEHICLE VIOLATIONS**

Senator Steele explained the bill to the committee.

Bonnie Macri and Monet Steens, Jedi Women, and Whitney Rearick, Utah Issues, spoke in opposition to the bill.

MOTION: Representative Adair moved that the bill be passed out favorably. The motion passed with Representatives Becker, King, Nelson and Ure voting no. Representative Beck was absent for the vote.

MOTION: Representative Siddoway moved that the meeting be adjourned. The motion passed unanimously with Representative Beck absent for the vote.
