Acting Chair Waddoups called the meeting to order at 8:15 a.m.

MOTION: Sen. Waddoups moved to approve the minutes of February 10, 1998.

The motion passed unanimously with Sen. Nielson absent for the vote.

1. **SB 217 TAX CREDIT FOR CLEAN FUEL VEHICLES** (*L. McAllister*)

Sen. McAllister distributed amendments and presented the bill to the committee with the assistance of Jack Elzondo, Questar.

MOTION: Sen. Montgomery moved to adopt the amendments as follows:

1. Page 1, Line 9: After "APPROPRIATING" delete "\$300,000" and insert "\$150,000"
2. Page 1, Line 26: Delete "fund" and insert "program"
3. Page 2, Line 3: Delete "deposit into" and after "the" delete "fund" insert "program"
4. Page 3, Line 26: After "of the" insert "incremental"
5. Page 5, Line 25: After "of the" insert "incremental"

6. Page 6, Line 29: After "1998-99" delete "\$300,000" and insert "\$150,000"
7. Page 7, Line 2: After "effect on" delete "July 1, 1998" and insert "January 1, 1999"

The motion passed unanimously with Sen. Nielson absent for the vote.

For the bill: Beverly Miller, Salt Lake Clean Cities, Robin Erickson, Newspaper Agency Corp., Diane Nielsen, Dept. Environmental Quality,

Against the bill: Walt Maguire, Chevron,

MOTION: Sen. Montgomery moved to pass the bill with a favorable recommendation.

The motion failed with Sens. Montgomery and Poulton voting in favor, and Sens. Nielson, Dmitrich, Stephenson and Waddoups voting against.

Sen. Nielson assumed the chair.

2. **SJR 12 RESOLUTION LIMITING PROPERTY TAX FOR RETIREES** (*R. Steiner*)

Sen. Steiner presented the bill to the committee.

Against the bill: Wes Quinton, Utah Taxpayer Assn.

MOTION: Sen. Dmitrich moved to pass the bill with a favorable recommendation.

The motion passed with Sen. Poulton voting against.

3. **HB 310 WRONGFUL APPROPRIATION** (*B. Holladay*)

Rep. Holladay presented the bill to the committee with the assistance of Michael Wims, Attorney General Office.

MOTION: Sen. Dmitrich moved to pass the bill with a favorable recommendation.

The motion passed with Sen. Poulton voting against.

4. **SB 61 EMPLOYMENT OF OUT OF STATE CONTRACTORS AND EMPLOYEES** (*E. Mayne*)

Sen. Mayne presented the bill to the committee and requested to hold the bill for further study.

MOTION: Sen. Stephenson moved to hold the bill.

The motion passed unanimously.

5. **SB 66 PROCUREMENT CODE REQUIREMENT OF HEALTH CARE BENEFITS FOR CONTRACTORS** (*E. Mayne*)

Sen. Mayne presented the bill to the committee.

Sen. Poulton declared a conflict of interest.

MOTION: Sen. Dmitrich moved to pass the bill with a favorable recommendation.

The motion passed with Sen. Poulton voting against.

6. **SB 212 TAX INCREMENT FINANCING OF REDEVELOPMENT AGENCIES** (*L. Mansell*)

Sen. Mansell presented the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Sen. Stephenson moved to pass the bill with a favorable recommendation.

The motion passed unanimously.

7. **HB 110 SALES TAX EXEMPTION FOR SEASONAL DESTINATION AMUSEMENT PARKS** (*M. Dillree*)

H. B. 110 was not heard due to the absence of the sponsor.

8. **HB 150 COUNTY OPTION SALES TAX FOR LONG TERM CARE CENTERS** (*J. Seitz*)

Rep. Seitz presented the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Sen. Montgomery moved to pass the bill with a favorable recommendation.

The motion passed with Sen. Stephenson voting against.

9. **1ST Sub. HB 357 TRANSIENT ROOM TAX AMENDMENTS** (*K. Johnson*)

Rep. Johnson presented the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Sen. Dmitrich moved to pass the bill with a favorable recommendation.

The motion passed unanimously.

MOTION: Sen. Poulton moved to adjourn.
