AN ACT RELATING TO APPROPRIATIONS; PROVIDING APPROPRIATIONS FOR SUPPORT OF STATE GOVERNMENT FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 1999 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2000, AND BEGINNING FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 1998 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 1999 FOR THE USE AND SUPPORT OF CERTAIN STATE DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES OF STATE GOVERNMENT AND PROVIDE APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE BILLS PASSED IN THE 1999 GENERAL SESSION WITH FISCAL IMPACT AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES AS IN THIS ACT PROVIDED; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Utah:

Section 1. Under the terms and conditions of Section 63-38-3, the following sums of money are appropriated out of money not otherwise appropriated from the funds or fund account indicated for the use and support of certain State departments and agencies for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999 and ending June 30, 2000. This is in addition to amounts appropriated in House Bill 1, 1999 General Session.

36 It is the intent of the Legislature that the Airport to University of Utah
 37 light rail line be built at an estimated cost of \$480 million, with federal
 38 appropriations pursuant to \$640 million authorized in the Transportation
 39 Equity Act of the 21st Century (Public Law 105-178). It is further the intent
 40 of the Legislature that the Utah Transit Authority will commit its revenues
 41 to offset operating costs associated with that line. It is also the intent of the
 42 Legislature that local governments within Salt Lake County pay the
 43 operating costs, such operating costs being covered by at least the Salt Lake
 44 City portion of the 1/64th sales tax previously dedicated by Section 59-12-
 45 103 of the Utah Code, which would exceed \$10 million over the 12-year
 46 period FY 2000-2011. The balance of the local share would be dedicated
 47 by capturing the enhanced local revenue generated by the construction of
 48 the rail system, including increased sales and city property taxes, which is
 49 estimated to be in excess of \$15 million from the period 1999-2001. This
 50 revenue would be captured by creating a Special Transit District or other
 51 appropriate means. It is the intent of the Legislature that if these funds as
 52 well as others, from these entities are insufficient, that by or during the
 53 2001 Annual General Session, operating funds be provided by the
 54 Legislature from state revenue and state authorizations for local revenues
 55 for operation of the Airport to University of Utah light rail line in an
 56 amount not to exceed \$5 million per year for a maximum of ten years.
