144           Section 1. Section **20A-1-102** is amended to read:

145           **20A-1-102. Definitions.**

146           As used in this title:

- 147           (1) "Active voter" means a registered voter who has not been classified as an inactive voter
- 148           by the county clerk.
- 149           (2) "Automatic tabulating equipment" means apparatus that automatically examines and
- 150           counts votes recorded on paper ballots or ballot cards and tabulates the results.
- 151           (3) "Ballot" means the cardboard, paper, or other material upon which a voter records his

152 votes and includes ballot cards, paper ballots, and secrecy envelopes.

153 (4) "Ballot card" means a ballot that can be counted using automatic tabulating equipment.

154 (5) "Ballot label" means the cards, papers, booklet, pages, or other materials that contain  
155 the names of offices and candidates and statements of ballot propositions to be voted on and which  
156 are used in conjunction with ballot cards.

157 (6) "Ballot proposition" means constitutional amendments, initiatives, referenda, judicial  
158 retention questions, opinion questions, and other questions submitted to the voters for their  
159 approval or rejection.

160 (7) "Board of canvassers" means the entities established by Sections 20A-4-301 and  
161 20A-4-306 to canvass election returns.

162 (8) "Book voter registration form" means voter registration forms contained in a bound  
163 book that are used by election officers and registration agents to register persons to vote.

164 (9) "Bond election" means an election held for the sole purpose of approving or rejecting  
165 the proposed issuance of bonds by a government entity.

166 (10) "By-mail voter registration form" means a voter registration form designed to be  
167 completed by the voter and mailed to the election officer.

168 (11) "Canvass" means the review of election returns and the official declaration of election  
169 results by the board of canvassers.

170 (12) "Canvassing judge" means an election judge designated to assist in counting ballots  
171 at the canvass.

172 (13) "Convention" means the political party convention at which party officers and  
173 delegates are selected.

174 (14) "Counting center" means one or more locations selected by the election officer in  
175 charge of the election for the automatic counting of ballots.

176 (15) "Counting judge" means a judge designated to count the ballots during election day.

177 (16) "Counting poll watcher" means a person selected as provided in Section 20A-3-201  
178 to witness the counting of ballots.

179 (17) "Counting room" means a suitable and convenient private place or room, immediately  
180 adjoining the place where the election is being held, for use by the counting judges to count ballots  
181 during election day.

182 (18) "County executive" means:

183 (a) the county commission in the traditional form of government established by [Section  
184 ~~17-4-2~~ and] Title 17, Chapter 5, County Commissioners and Legislative Bodies;

185 (b) the county executive in the county executive and chief administrative officer-council  
186 optional form of government authorized by Section 17-35a-501;

187 (c) the county executive in the county executive-council optional form of government  
188 authorized by Section 17-35a-502;

189 (d) the county council in the council-manager optional form of government authorized by  
190 Section 17-35a-503; and

191 (e) the county council in the council-county administrative officer optional form of  
192 government authorized by Section 17-35a-504.

193 (19) "County legislative body" means:

194 (a) the county commission in the traditional form of government established by [Section  
195 ~~17-4-2~~ and] Title 17, Chapter 5, County Commissioners and Legislative Bodies;

196 (b) the county council in the county executive and chief administrative officer-council  
197 optional form of government authorized by Section 17-35a-501;

198 (c) the county council in the county executive-council optional form of government  
199 authorized by Section 17-35a-502;

200 (d) the county council in the council-manager optional form of government authorized by  
201 Section 17-35a-503; and

202 (e) the county council in the council-county administrative officer optional form of  
203 government authorized by Section 17-35a-504.

204 (20) "County officers" means those county officers that are required by law to be elected.

205 (21) "Election" means a regular general election, a municipal general election, a statewide  
206 special election, a local special election, a regular primary election, a municipal primary election,  
207 and a special district election.

208 (22) "Election cycle" means the period beginning on the first day persons are eligible to  
209 file declarations of candidacy and ending when the canvass is completed.

210 (23) "Election judge" means each canvassing judge, counting judge, and receiving judge.

211 (24) "Election officer" means:

212 (a) the [~~lieutenant governor~~] executive director of the State Elections Commission, for all  
213 statewide ballots;

214 (b) the county clerk or clerks for all county ballots and for certain special district and  
215 school district ballots as provided in Section 20A-5-400.5;

216 (c) the municipal clerk for all municipal ballots and for certain special district and school  
217 district ballots as provided in Section 20A-5-400.5; and

218 (d) the special district clerk or chief executive officer for all special district ballots that are  
219 not part of a statewide, county, or municipal ballot.

220 (25) "Election official" means any election officer, election judge, or satellite registrar.

221 (26) "Election returns" includes the pollbook, all affidavits of registration, the military and  
222 overseas absentee voter registration and voting certificates, one of the tally sheets, any unprocessed  
223 absentee ballots, all counted ballots, all excess ballots, all unused ballots, all spoiled ballots, the  
224 ballot disposition form, and the total votes cast form.

225 (27) "Electronic voting system" means a system in which a voting device is used in  
226 conjunction with ballots so that votes recorded by the voter are counted and tabulated by automatic  
227 tabulating equipment.

228 (28) "Inactive voter" means a registered voter who has been sent the notice required by  
229 Section 20A-2-306 and who has failed to respond to that notice.

230 (29) "Inspecting poll watcher" means a person selected as provided in this title to witness  
231 the receipt and safe deposit of voted and counted ballots.

232 (30) "Judicial office" means the office filled by any judicial officer.

233 (31) "Judicial officer" means any justice or judge of a court of record or any county court  
234 judge.

235 (32) "Local election" means a regular municipal election, a local special election, a special  
236 district election, and a bond election.

237 (33) "Local political subdivision" means a county, a municipality, a special district, or a  
238 local school district.

239 (34) "Local special election" means a special election called by the governing body of a  
240 local political subdivision in which all registered voters of the local political subdivision may vote.

241 (35) "Municipal executive" means:

242 (a) the city commission, city council, or town council in the traditional management  
243 arrangement established by Title 10, Chapter 3, Part 1, Governing Body;

244 (b) the mayor in the council-mayor optional form of government defined in Section

245 10-3-1209; and

246 (c) the manager in the council-manager optional form of government defined in Section  
247 10-3-1209.

248 (36) "Municipal general election" means the election held in municipalities and special  
249 districts on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each odd-numbered year for  
250 the purposes established in Section 20A-1-202.

251 (37) "Municipal legislative body" means:

252 (a) the city commission, city council, or town council in the traditional management  
253 arrangement established by Title 10, Chapter 3, Part 1, Governing Body;

254 (b) the municipal council in the council-mayor optional form of government defined in  
255 Section 10-3-1209; and

256 (c) the municipal council in the council-manager optional form of government defined in  
257 Section 10-3-1209.

258 (38) "Municipal officers" means those municipal officers that are required by law to be  
259 elected.

260 (39) "Municipal primary election" means an election held to nominate candidates for  
261 municipal office.

262 (40) "Official ballot" means the ballots distributed by the election officer to the election  
263 judges to be given to voters to record their votes.

264 (41) "Official endorsement" means:

265 (a) the information on the ballot that identifies:

266 (i) the ballot as an official ballot;

267 (ii) the date of the election; and

268 (iii) the facsimile signature of the election officer; and

269 (b) the information on the ballot stub that identifies:

270 (i) the election judge's initials; and

271 (ii) the ballot number.

272 (42) "Official register" means the book furnished election officials by the election officer  
273 that contains the information required by Section 20A-5-401.

274 (43) "Paper ballot" means a paper that contains:

275 (a) the names of offices and candidates and statements of ballot propositions to be voted

276 on; and

277 (b) spaces for the voter to record his vote for each office and for or against each ballot  
278 proposition.

279 (44) "Political party" means an organization of registered voters that has qualified to  
280 participate in an election by meeting the requirements of Title 20A, Chapter 8, Political Party  
281 Formation and Procedures.

282 (45) "Polling place" means the building where residents of a voting precinct vote.

283 (46) "Position" means a square, circle, rectangle, or other geometric shape on a ballot in  
284 which the voter marks his choice.

285 (47) "Posting list" means a list of registered voters within a voting precinct.

286 (48) "Primary convention" means the political party conventions at which nominees for  
287 the regular primary election are selected.

288 (49) "Protective counter" means a separate counter, which cannot be reset, that is built into  
289 a voting machine and records the total number of movements of the operating lever.

290 (50) "Qualify" or "qualified" means to take the oath of office and begin performing the  
291 duties of the position for which the person was elected.

292 (51) "Receiving judge" means the election judge that checks the voter's name in the official  
293 register, provides the voter with a ballot, and removes the ballot stub from the ballot after the voter  
294 has voted.

295 (52) "Registration days" means the days designated in Section 20A-2-203 when a voter  
296 may register to vote with a satellite registrar.

297 (53) "Registration form" means a book voter registration form and a by-mail voter  
298 registration form.

299 (54) "Regular general election" means the election held throughout the state on the first  
300 Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each even-numbered year for the purposes  
301 established in Section 20A-1-201.

302 (55) "Regular primary election" means the election on the fourth Tuesday of June of each  
303 even-numbered year, at which candidates of political parties and nonpolitical groups are voted for  
304 nomination.

305 (56) "Resident" means a person who resides within a specific voting precinct in Utah.

306 (57) "Sample ballot" means a mock ballot similar in form to the official ballot printed and

307 distributed as provided in Section 20A-5-405.

308 (58) "Satellite registrar" means a person appointed under Section 20A-5-201 to register  
309 voters and perform other duties.

310 (59) "Scratch vote" means to mark or punch the straight party ticket and then mark or  
311 punch the ballot for one or more candidates who are members of different political parties.

312 (60) "Secrecy envelope" means the envelope given to a voter along with the ballot into  
313 which the voter places the ballot after he has voted it in order to preserve the secrecy of the voter's  
314 vote.

315 (61) "Special election" means an election held as authorized by Section 20A-1-204.

316 (62) "Special district" means those local government entities created under the authority  
317 of Title 17A.

318 (63) "Special district officers" means those special district officers that are required by law  
319 to be elected.

320 (64) "Spoiled ballot" means each ballot that:

321 (a) is spoiled by the voter;

322 (b) is unable to be voted because it was spoiled by the printer or the election judge; or

323 (c) lacks the official endorsement.

324 (65) "Statewide special election" means a special election called by the governor or the  
325 Legislature in which all registered voters in Utah may vote.

326 (66) "Stub" means the detachable part of each ballot.

327 (67) "Substitute ballots" means replacement ballots provided by an election officer to the  
328 election judges when the official ballots are lost or stolen.

329 (68) "Ticket" means each list of candidates for each political party or for each group of  
330 petitioners.

331 (69) "Transfer case" means the sealed box used to transport voted ballots to the counting  
332 center.

333 (70) "Vacancy" means the absence of a person to serve in any position created by statute,  
334 whether that absence occurs because of death, disability, disqualification, resignation, or other  
335 cause.

336 (71) "Valid write-in candidate" means a candidate who has qualified as a write-in  
337 candidate by following the procedures and requirements of this title.

338 (72) "Voter" means a person who meets the requirements of election registration and is  
339 registered and is listed in the official register book.

340 (73) "Voting area" means the area within six feet of the voting booths, voting machines,  
341 and ballot box.

342 (74) "Voting booth" means the space or compartment within a polling place that is  
343 provided for the preparation of ballots and includes the voting machine enclosure or curtain.

344 (75) "Voting device" means:

345 (a) an apparatus in which ballot cards are used in connection with a punch device for  
346 piercing the ballots by the voter;

347 (b) a device for marking the ballots with ink or another substance; or

348 (c) any other method for recording votes on ballots so that the ballot may be tabulated by  
349 means of automatic tabulating equipment.

350 (76) "Voting machine" means a machine designed for the sole purpose of recording and  
351 tabulating votes cast by voters at an election.

352 (77) "Voting poll watcher" means a person appointed as provided in this title to witness  
353 the distribution of ballots and the voting process.

354 (78) "Voting precinct" means the smallest voting unit established as provided by law  
355 within which qualified voters vote at one polling place.

356 (79) "Watcher" means a voting poll watcher, a counting poll watcher, and an inspecting  
357 poll watcher.

358 (80) "Write-in ballot" means a ballot containing any write-in votes.

359 (81) "Write-in vote" means a vote cast for a person whose name is not printed on the ballot  
360 according to the procedures established in this title.

361 Section 2. Section **20A-1-305** is amended to read:

362 **20A-1-305. Publication and distribution of election laws.**

363 (1) The [lieutenant governor] State Elections Commission shall:

364 (a) publish a sufficient number of copies of Title 20A, Election Code, and any other  
365 provisions of law that govern elections; and

366 (b) transmit copies to each county clerk.

367 (2) Each county clerk shall:

368 (a) inform the [lieutenant governor] State Elections Commission of the number of copies

369 needed; and

370 (b) furnish each election officer in the county with one copy.

371 Section 3. Section **20A-1-703** is amended to read:

372 **20A-1-703. Proceedings by registered voter.**

373 (1) Any registered voter who has information that any provisions of this title have been  
374 violated by any candidate for whom the registered voter had the right to vote, by any personal  
375 campaign committee of that candidate, by any member of that committee, or by any election  
376 official, may file a verified petition with the [~~lieutenant governor~~] State Elections Commission.

377 (2) (a) The [~~lieutenant governor~~] State Elections Commission shall gather information and  
378 determine if a special investigation is necessary.

379 (b) If the [~~lieutenant governor~~] State Elections Commission determines that a special  
380 investigation is necessary, the [~~lieutenant governor~~] State Elections Commission shall refer the  
381 information to the attorney general, who shall:

382 (i) bring a special proceeding to investigate and determine whether or not there has been  
383 a violation; and

384 (ii) appoint special counsel to conduct that proceeding on behalf of the state.

385 (3) If it appears from the petition or otherwise that sufficient evidence is obtainable to  
386 show that there is probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred, the attorney general  
387 shall:

388 (a) grant leave to bring the proceeding; and

389 (b) appoint special counsel to conduct the proceeding.

390 (4) (a) If leave is granted, the registered voter may, by a special proceeding brought in the  
391 district court in the name of the state upon the relation of the registered voter, investigate and  
392 determine whether or not the candidate, candidate's personal campaign committee, any member  
393 of the candidate's personal campaign committee, or any election officer has violated any provision  
394 of this title.

395 (b) (i) In the proceeding, the complaint shall:

396 (A) be served with the summons; and

397 (B) set forth the name of the person or persons who have allegedly violated this title and  
398 the grounds of those violations in detail.

399 (ii) The complaint may not be amended except by leave of the court.

400 (iii) The summons and complaint in the proceeding shall be filed with the court no later  
401 than five days after they are served.

402 (c) (i) The answer to the complaint shall be served and filed within ten days after the  
403 service of the summons and complaint.

1235 (l) print and deliver official ballot cards, official ballot labels, sample ballots, and  
1236 instruction cards at the expense of the jurisdiction conducting the election.

1237 (3) (a) Each election officer shall, without delay, correct any error discovered in any  
1238 official paper ballot, ballot label, or sample ballot, if the correction can be made without interfering  
1239 with the timely distribution of paper ballots and ballot labels.

1240 (b) If the election officer discovers errors or omissions in the paper ballots or ballot labels  
1241 and it is not possible to correct the errors or omissions by reprinting the paper ballots or ballot  
1242 labels, the election officer shall direct the election judges to make the necessary corrections on the  
1243 official paper ballots or ballot labels before they are distributed at the polls.

1244 (c) (i) If the election officer refuses or fails to correct an error or omission in the paper  
1245 ballots or ballot labels, a candidate or his agent may file a verified petition with the district court  
1246 asserting that:

1247 (A) an error or omission has occurred in the publication of the name or description of a  
1248 candidate or in the printing of sample or official paper ballots or ballot labels; and

- 1278 (e) the party name or title is printed in capital letters not less than 1/4 of an inch high;
- 1279 (f) a circle 1/2 inch in diameter is printed immediately below the party name or title, and
- 1280 the top of the circle is placed not less than two inches below the perforated line;
- 1281 (g) unaffiliated candidates and candidates not affiliated with a registered political party are
- 1282 listed in one column, without a party circle, with the following instructions printed at the head of
- 1283 the column: "All candidates not affiliated with a political party are listed below. They are to be
- 1284 considered with all offices and candidates listed to the left. Only one vote is allowed for each
- 1285 office.";
- 1286 (h) the columns containing the lists of candidates, including the party name and device,
- 1287 are separated by heavy parallel lines;

1306 running vertically the full length of the nonpartisan ballot copy; and

1307 (o) constitutional amendments or other questions submitted to the vote of the people, are  
1308 printed on the ballot after the list of candidates.

1309 (2) Each election officer shall ensure that:

1310 (a) each person nominated by any political party or group of petitioners is placed on the  
1311 ballot:

1312 (i) under the party name and emblem, if any; or

1313 (ii) under the title of the party or group as designated by them in their certificates of  
1314 nomination or petition, or, if none is designated, then under some suitable title;

1315 (b) the names of all unaffiliated candidates that qualify as required in Title 20A, Chapter  
1316 9, Part 5, Candidates not Affiliated with a Party, are placed on the ballot;

1324 (c) the words, "Vote for one" or "Vote for two or more" extend to the extreme right of the

1326 (d) the nonpartisan candidates are grouped according to the office for which they are  
1327 candidates;

1328 (e) the names in each group are placed in alphabetical order with the surnames last, except  
1329 for candidates for the State Board of Education and local school boards;

1343 (1) Each election officer shall ensure, for paper ballots in regular general elections, that:

1344 (a) except for candidates for state school board and local school boards:

1345 (i) each candidate is listed by party; and

1346 (ii) candidates' surnames are listed in alphabetical order on the ballots when two or more  
1347 candidates' names are required to be listed on a ticket under the title of an office;

1494 (b) be ruled with a horizontal line 3/4 inch from the top, with the space above that line  
1495 blank for the purpose of binding;

1499 (e) contain, to the right of the word "Warning," the following statement printed or typed

1533 **sponsors with materials.**

1534 (1) In order to obtain the necessary number of signatures required by this part, the sponsors

7063 (1) The Judicial Council, established by Article VIII, Section 12, Utah Constitution, shall

- 7065 (a) the chief justice of the Supreme Court;  
7066 (b) one member elected by the justices of the Supreme Court;  
7067 (c) one member elected by the judges of the Court of Appeals;
