MOTION: Rep. Biskupski moved to approve minutes of February 10, 1999 with the following change in spelling of Leslie Kellan, to Leslie Kelen. The motion passed unanimously.

For: Department of Human Resource Management

It is the intent of the Legislature that the Department of Human Resource Management conduct a study comparing correctional officer and public safety compensation with the market, for review during the 2000 Legislative Session.

For: Department of Community and Economic Development
Department of Human Resource Management
Career Service Review Board

From: Capital Facilities and Administrative Services Subcommittee

It is the intent of the legislature that all state agencies, in cooperation with the Division of Fleet Operations, fully implement the three core components of CARS fleet information system by July 1, 1999 in accordance with UCA 63A-9-0401(1)(b). The three core components are 1) inventory tracking center, 2) Motor Pool Utilization Center (Reservations) and 3) Work Order Center. The Legislature intends that all state agencies fully utilize CARS to obtain at least six calendar months of fleet cost data prior to the FY2000 General Session.

For: Division of Community Development

It is the intent of the Legislature that the Office of Community Services shall act as the state agency responsible for the evaluation and improvement of emergency food assistance services in Utah and monitor the impact of Welfare Reform on the emergency food network.

For: Division of Business and Economic Development
From: Rick Mayfield

It is intent of the Legislature that the Division of Business and Economic Development use remaining Defense Conversion funds for other job training programs and promotional opportunities.

For: Community Development

It is the intent of the Legislature that the Division of Community Development establish Permanent Community Impact Board and Community Development Block Grant allocation preferences for counties and municipalities that have master plans with affordable housing plans.

For: Utah State Fair Park

It is the intent of the Legislature that the Fairpark obtain matching funds on at least a dollar for dollar basis from private entities whenever it contracts for master plans or feasibility studies of plans that have substantial, long term involvement of private entities as partners, tenants, or facility owners on Fairpark property.

Blackham made a motion to approve the tentative budgets for Housing Development, The Division of Business and Economic Development, The Utah State Fair, and Utah Technology Finance Corporation and with the adjustments to the Tentative Budgets shown on the handout, make this the Committee's Final Recommendation to Executive Appropriations with Hill Field Easements, Literary Volunteers, Olene Walker Housing Trust, and Travel Council as shown on the handout as the Committee's top priorities for additional funding. The motion passed unanimously, with eight present, one absent.
