The House passed **H.B. 3, SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS II**, by Representative J. Alexander, and it is transmitted for consideration with the following amendments:

1. Page 6, Line 206:
After line 206 insert:
"IT IS THE INTENT OF THE LEGISLATURE THAT THE TWO NEW TROOPERS BE ASSIGNED TO ADD TO THE HIGHWAY PATROL COVERAGE ON STATE ROUTE 6 BETWEEN SPANISH FORK AND PRICE, UTAH, UNTIL THE ROAD IS RECONSTRUCTED."

2. Page 7, Line 215:
After line 215 insert:
"IT IS THE INTENT OF THE LEGISLATURE THAT THESE FUNDS SUPPORT RURAL GOVERNMENT ACQUISITION OF DIGITAL GEOGRAPHIC DATA, INTEGRATING SYSTEMS, AND SUPPORTING ACTIVITIES. DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS BY THE AUTOMATED GEOGRAPHIC REFERENCE CENTER WILL BE BASED ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS DEVELOPED AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE RURAL PARTNERSHIP BOARD AND THE UTAH ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES."

3. Page 12, Line 420:
Delete "form" and insert "from"

4. Page 23, Line 793:
After line 793 insert:
"INTENT LANGUAGE FOR CONSIDERATION BY EXECUTIVE APPROPRIATIONS IT IS THE INTENT OF THE LEGISLATURE THAT THE STATE SYSTEMS OF PUBLIC AND HIGHER EDUCATION SHOULD INCLUDE IN THEIR CONSIDERATIONS AND NEGOTIATIONS FOR HEALTH INSURANCE BENEFITS THE OPTION OF A BENEFITS PLAN COMPRISED OF HIGH DEDUCTIBLE MAJOR MEDICAL COVERAGE, A MINIMUM OF \$1,000, AN EMPLOYER SPONSORED MEDICAL REIMBURSEMENT OR SAVINGS PLAN, AND ANY OTHER SECONDARY HEALTH INSURANCE PLANS THAT ARE NECESSARY AND APPROPRIATE TO COVER ROUTINE MEDICAL EXPENSES INCURRED UP TO THE MAJOR MEDICAL DEDUCTIBLE.

IT IS THE FURTHER INTENT OF THE LEGISLATURE THAT THE STATE SYSTEMS OF PUBLIC AND HIGHER EDUCATION AND THE PUBLIC EMPLOYEES ADMINISTRATION REVIEW THEIR HEALTH BENEFIT PLANS ANNUALLY AND SUBMIT THOSE PLANS FOR COMPETITIVE BIDDING AT LEAST ONCE EVERY THREE YEARS. "

406 It is further the Legislature’s intent that municipalities and counties rely
407 upon existing state law to develop dispersal restrictions that address the
408 concerns of neighborhoods in maintaining the integrity of their environment,
409 prevents the excessive grouping of people with disabilities requiring
410 residential supports, accommodates the needs of people with disabilities in
411 residential services to access appropriate services, transportation, and
412 opportunities for integration, and which places such residences in
413 neighborhoods that positively support their needs.

414 It is further the Legislature’s intent that municipalities and counties allow
415 for consideration of exception to the dispersal requirements on a case-by-
416 case basis. It is the sense of the legislature that providers are responsible to
417 demonstrate to the municipality or county why their facility should be
418 granted this exemption.

419 The Legislature acknowledges that state and federal fair housing law
420 exempts from its coverage anyone who, despite services and
421 accommodations, poses a direct threat to the health or safety of other
422 individuals or whose tenancy would result in substantial physical damage
423 to the property of others.
