| 12 | (1) The State Board of Education shall conduct a study during the year 2000 interim to |

| 14 | (a) if there should be an optimum size for school districts within the state's public |
| 15 | education system, based upon student population; |
| 16 | (b) whether smaller school districts, in terms of student population, would better promote |
| 17 | the mission and maintain the characteristics of the state's public education system detailed in |
| 18 | Sections 53A-1a-103 and 53A-1a-104; and |
| 19 | (c) whether a ceiling or range on the size of school districts, in terms of student population |
| 20 | should be established in statute. |
