13	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
14	Section 1. Section 53A-15-202.5 is amended to read:
15	53A-15-202.5. Applied technology centers.
16	The following applied technology centers are established to assist in providing applied
17	technology education in an efficient and cost-effective manner throughout the state:
18	(1) Bridgerland Applied Technology Center;
19	(2) Davis Applied Technology Center;
20	(3) Ogden-Weber Applied Technology Center;
21	(4) Wasatch Front South Applied Technology Center; [and]
22	(5) Uintah Basin Applied Technology Center[-]: and
23	(6) Southwest Applied Technology Center.
24	Section 2. Legislative intent.
25	(1) It is the intent of the Legislature that for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, the
26	current funding for the Southwest Applied Technology Service Region to public and higher
27	education be consolidated as a public education appropriation to fund the Southwest Applied

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28	Technology Center.
29	(2) It is the intent of the Legislature that for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and for
30	each fiscal year thereafter, the Legislature shall provide a line item under public education in the
31	Appropriations Act to fund the Southwest Applied Technology Center.
32	Section 3. Effective date.
33	This act takes effect on July 1, 2000.
