(iv) all the franchisor's franchise agreements confer rights on the franchisee to develop and operate as many dealership facilities as the franchisee and franchisor shall agree are appropriate within a defined geographic territory or area; and

(v) as of January 1, 2000, no fewer than half of the franchisees of the line make within the state own and operate two or more dealership facilities in the geographic area covered by the franchise agreement.”;

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE BOURDEAUX

Today the world's eyes are on us. This is not about white or black, Democrat or Republican, or rich or poor. It is an opportunity for us to continue Dr. Martin

Luther King, Jr.'s legacy. After 14 years we will be able to share our interdependence and mutuality, as well as stressing our similarities and recognizing our positive differences.

The Constitution of the United States was the result of passionate persistence and a strong vision for a greater country and a more just way of life. It is a respected and esteemed document which we all hold close to our hearts. We venerate it because it reaffirms our individuality and our value as free people. We respect and celebrate the people who had the persistence and vision to write it. However, that great work was not complete in 1787. It took subsequent generations with similar persistence and vision to create a more just and inclusive America. It has been amended over 20 times. It is important for us to reflect upon and celebrate these achievements as well. They are proof that America is alive and is always changing, a country which is working toward a more complete living reality of our forefathers' vision.

Dr. Martin Luther, King, Jr. was the embodiment of the best America is and has to offer. He worked tirelessly for the realization of the promises and principles of the Constitution - justice, the principle of freedom, and equality of all. He brought to light that all people in the United States were guaranteed but not afforded the rights that were promised in that precious document. He made every American examine his or her conscience and decide if America was all that it should be. He revolutionized the way America viewed itself and expanded the vision of this great land.....“We the people” became a complete statement.

Dr. King was able to unify people of all different backgrounds in the Civil Rights Movement. People from all walks of life, all creeds, colors, and races joined hands with Dr. King to demand the betterment of society. The Civil Rights Movement was never just about African-Americans, which has been alleged, but rather about affirming the equality of all people. Women, Hispanics, Native Americans, and countless other groups were part of the movement and beneficiaries of his efforts. The Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964, which was one of the major achievements of the Civil Rights Movement, it outlawed discrimination “on the basis of race, color, sex, religion or national origin.” This law would never have been so inclusive if it were not for the inclusivity of Dr. King's message. In his short life he united vastly different people in the universal struggle for dignity, respect, and justice. He helped break down the barriers of segregation -- segregated housing, segregated schools, segregated buses, and segregated workplaces. He was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize on December 10, 1964, for his incredible and successful work.

In 1983, President Ronald Reagan declared the birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. a federal holiday. In his proclamation, President Reagan said the following:

“The majesty of his message, the dignity of his bearing, and the righteousness of his cause are a lasting legacy. In a few short years he changed America for all time. He made it possible for our nation to move closer to the ideals set forth in the Declaration of Independence: that all people are created equal and are endowed with inalienable rights that government has the duty and respect to protect.”

In 1986, Utah State Senator Terry Williams introduced S.B. 17 to have January 15 recognized as Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day. With the personal visit of Dr. King’s widow, Coretta Scott King, on February 6, 1986, Utah became the 48th state to celebrate the nation’s newest holiday as Human Rights Day.

Dr. King’s vision was one of a land where our children “would not be judged by the color of their skin, but by the content of their character.” His dream was one of peaceful existence, and he was the champion of compassion. He fought intolerance and violence with loving patience and peaceful resistance. He enunciated our forefathers’ vision for all of America, and created a revolution similar to that of our forefathers. He fought seemingly impossible odds to make life fundamentally better for every American. Life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness became possible for more of America than ever before because of his respectful and peaceful revolution, known as the Civil Rights Movement.

Dr. King was only 38 years old when he was brutally gunned down in Memphis, Tennessee, on April 4, 1968. This violent act was shocking to the nation’s soul, just as was the assassination of President John F. Kennedy in 1963.

“Dr. Martin Luther King preached the doctrine enunciated by the Savior in his Sermon on the Mount, and he was resented as a heretic. He preached the doctrine of Patrick Henry of liberty from oppression, and he was denounced. He preached the doctrine of Abraham Lincoln of equality and recited the Fourteenth Amendment and was disclaimed as a rebel rouser. He studied the life of Mahatma Ghandi of passive resistance and non-violence and was assassinated for his trouble. I say he used some rather well chosen authorities for his pronouncements.

Our country will remain socially ill until its people are willing to accept four square and without reservation the proposition that all God’s creatures are equal in His sight.

But I say that no nation has ever existed which had or has a better chance for a truly moral government than ours. There are still many patriots in this country who

devote their lives to the American dream. Some of these men are former Presidents. Some of them are in Congress. Some are just ordinary people with an extraordinary amount of compassion for their fellow man.....Dr. Martin Luther King preached the truth. And he bothered the conscience of America. I say thank God we have a conscience that is capable of being bothered!”

Dr. King was the embodiment of American ideals. He was bright, passionate, persistent, and deeply devoted to God and country. He spoke his heart and worked to create a better life for future generations. Our nation’s holidays are special days. Some are days of celebration. Dr. King’s day is also a day of remembering and celebrating, but it is even more than that. It must be a day of service. Martin Luther King, Jr. believed that “everybody can be great because anyone can serve.” So let our observance of the holiday be a time for all of us to remember the life, work, and dream of Martin Luther King, Jr., to celebrate in the true spirit of togetherness and community. Most important, let the holiday be a catalyst for individuals, families, organizations, and communities. Let it be an act-to, live the dream by serving the causes of equality, justice, freedom, and peace.

Now is the time. This is the place. I invite you to help build an American tradition; to remember, to celebrate, and to act. I want to personally thank each and every one of you that have supported this change.

I have a dream and I am optimistic that it will come true today! He is a man worth remembering. Let us proclaim this day as Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day. I urge your support. Get on board with us, so we can continue to move our state and country forward to a brighter future for you and me.

FOR OURSELVES AND OUR POSTERITY
BY LEGRAND HUNSAKER

“America is in crisis. Once united by the war against Great Britain, the states are now deeply divided over matters of policy and commerce. Each state pursues its own destiny, which weakens our trade abroad and creates near anarchy at home. Unless a means can be found to unite the states, I fear the worst for my country. Its life may be as the flame of a candle, bright, but brief.” This was the sentiment of James Madison in the year 1786. Madison, seeing the precarious conditions and lack of interdependency between the states felt an urgency to do something. Nothing was required of him; he could have just let it pass, deciding that someone else should take care of it. After all he was only one, a humble legislator in Virginia he could not do everything. Surely someone else more experienced should accomplish the task. But it was not so. Feeling that best government that was possible was the only means of survival for the United States, he began to make things happen. Writing letters, researching, and forming a plan for some of the most brilliant minds of the world to consider, he showed the effect that one citizen can have on the destiny of a nation “in order to form a more perfect union...for ourselves and our posterity....”

The late war with Great Britain had been fueled by the efforts of the Founding Fathers. The voice of Patrick Henry’s echoed throughout the war with the immortal words “Is Life so dear or peace so sweet as to be purchased at the price of chains and slavery? Forbid it Almighty God! I know not what course others may take, but as for me give me liberty or give me death.” The Declaration of Independence also shows this sentiment when in 1776, 56 men pledged their allegiance to the most important decision in their lives, declaring, “And for the support of this Declaration, with firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor.” All who signed the Declaration, knew full well that it could be their epitaph, their final important act; for as soon as the pen left their hand, they became marked men - marked as traitors to the crown of England.

In 1783, the war ended and the struggle for Independence and sovereignty was over...or was it just beginning? George Washington, aging and in poor health was asked by Madison to again come to the aid of his country. Of all people, had he not done enough? Yet, though he had only been home from the war just over 3 years, again he responded to the call. Why? “...to insure domestic tranquility...for ourselves and our posterity..”.

On May 25, 1787 the Convention began. And throughout the sweltering heat of the Philadelphia summer, behind closed doors to insure the utmost secrecy, the patriots met. Hammering out a plan, not just for themselves, but for “We, the

People.” Their entire interest was in creating a government that would “secure the Blessings of Liberty...”

For nearly 5 long and tiring months, they debated, each side with their principles for good government. James Madison said of the challenge, “We faced a task more difficult than can be conceived by those not concerned with its execution, men of different minds and diverse opinions came together to debate our great cause. And yet, the degree of content which ultimately prevailed was a miracle”.

Franklin realized this and implored the Convention, “The longer I live, the more convincing proof I see of this truth that God governs in the affairs of men, and if a sparrow cannot fall to the ground without his notice, is it probable that an empire can rise without his aid.”

And so, because of “His aid”, on September 17, 1787, the constitution was signed. The founders had brought together the pieces into a living document. The Preamble, a concise statement of their goals, read: “We, the people of the United State, in order to form a more perfect union, establish justice, insure domestic tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general welfare and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.” It is the duty of “We the people” to perpetuate the “more perfect union” that they had struggled to form. True justice was established for all people. When each is protected in his inalienable rights, there most assuredly is “Domestic Tranquility.” Common Defense was provided for in clauses 10-16 of Article I Section 8. By pursuing the idea of “All men are created equal”, they had made provisions for promoting the general welfare. And under the Constitution, like nowhere else in the world the blessings of Liberty were secure, if they and their posterity would, as John Adams counseled, be moral and religious. Otherwise, “it is wholly inadequate.” Washington, realizing that it was, as Franklin expressed “the rising sun,” stated, “This is for me a great moment. I have prayed for it and I will continue to pray for the success of this document for I believe it is to be the hope of this country.”

John Quincy Adams, said to us, “Posterity - you will never know how much it has cost my generation to preserve your liberty. I hope you will make good use of it.”

Let us continue the heritage that has been forged, ourselves becoming a strong link in the chain that must serve as a life line to Liberty. May I suggest some things that we as citizens may do to “ordain and establish this Constitution for ourselves and our posterity:

First, may we realize and appreciate the fact that this republic was founded not only by men, but by God as well. We owe a great debt to him for this country and for allowing us the privilege of upholding “The greatest work ever struck off at any given moment by the brain and purpose of man” as stated by William Gladstone.

Second, let us remember that the price of liberty is eternal vigilance and therefore we must become active champions of the constitution, fighting to maintain the liberties that were secured under the constitution by voting, serving jury duty, exercising those rights that are granted to us under the constitution, seeking out and supporting good and wise candidates that truly represent our views, and letting our voice be heard.

Third, we must study the Constitution and learn of the principles of government contained therein, on our own, as well as in our schools, and at home. We must study the classics the founders studied, so that we may know what they knew, in order that we may do what they did, if called upon to secure our liberty. And we must teach them to our posterity to perpetuate this divine republic.

And last but not least, we must never forget the affect that one person can have on the destiny of a nation. Madison, Washington, Franklin - they were all like us, humble citizens. They did what was best for their fellow man without thought of reward. Let us keep the Constitution a living document by living the words spoken by Edward Everett Hale: “I am only one, but I am one, I cannot do everything, but I can do something. What I can do, I should do, and with the help of God, I will do.”

AMERICA- REMEMBER AND RENEW

Rabbi Daniel Lapin came to America for an intended three week visit. He assumed his adventure would be much like his visits to other countries, but instead of returning to his home in South Africa he decided to stay in America.

Why would a South African Jew want to live in America? What was it that this country had to offer him? Rabbi Lapin discovered that America was founded on a religious ideal, and it was because of this ideal that he decided to stay. What other country on the earth places “In God We Trust” on its currency? Where can you find so many copies of the Bible in homes?

I'd like to make three points worth remembering and renewing in order for future generations to enjoy the blessings of freedom.

The first point, as Rabbi Lapin discovered, is the belief in a Supreme Being. I join Rabbi Lapin, now a great American citizen, in his words when he says, “I am grateful for the religious outlook that guided the founders of this country.”

The Civil War was the bloodiest most gruesome war this country has ever seen. Abraham Lincoln was disturbed by the state of the country in 1863, and sent a proclamation to the States saying, "We have been preserved these many years in peace and prosperity; we have grown in numbers, wealth, and power as no other nation has ever grown...and we have vainly imagined, in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient, too proud to pray to the God that made us." What was it that the American people forgot in 1863 that we have also forgotten today? As Lincoln stated, "We have forgotten God." We have forgotten the hand which has preserved us a nation, multiplied, enriched, and strengthened us. This country was founded on the belief in a Supreme being and it is because of this belief that America has had amazing success for over two hundred years. With a renewed belief our freedoms will continue to be secured.

Second, we need to remember the proper role of government. Laws are made for the good and safety of a society. We need to remember the Founder's vision of a strong but limited government. In Thomas Jefferson's first inaugural address he recognized the many blessings bestowed on our country. To make America a happy and prosperous nation one additional thing was needed, "A wise and frugal government, which shall restrain men from injuring one another, [but] shall leave them otherwise free to regulate their own pursuits of industry and improvement, and shall not take from the mouth of labor the bread it has earned." Today instead of solving their own problems, many people look to the government for answers, guarantees, special privileges, etc. To address these problems laws are passed then restricting our freedom, and yet fail to solve the personal problem. The Constitution defines the bounds of the national government. Any thrust beyond those bounds only degrades the sacred document that the finest minds in history spent months drafting. We must be careful not to vote away our freedom when adding amendments to this document which only give government more power and open the door to tyranny. We must renew our devotion to honor and maintain the Constitution.

Third, we need to remember the true meaning of freedom under law. This term is used loosely in excusing wrong actions by saying that in America we are free to do as we please. America is a free country, but with the word FREE also comes responsibility. To be a good American citizen we must pay the price. Thomas Paine stated, "Those who expect to reap the blessing of freedom must, like men, undergo the fatigue of supporting it." Supporting freedom involves being an active citizen. Evil will prevail if the majority of Americans fail to contribute to society. We have the right to speak our mind, to influence others, to make sure our freedom is secured. But we need to remember that freedom is not

just about individual rights; it is also about general principles, for as Dwight D. Eisenhower said, "A people that values its privileges above its principles soon loses both." I learned this statement for myself when this March I had an opportunity to attend a leadership conference at Valley Forge with high school students from all over the United States. For three days we learned about individual rights, and what I could do to protect them. I learned that is not easy to be a real patriot, one who contributes time and talents to better their country. At one point, we students split into groups and acted as a school board trying to solve problems given to us. I realized there would be no need for so many restrictions if people knew the true meaning of freedom and would learn to govern themselves. for as Abraham Lincoln said, "Freedom is not the right to do what we want, but what we ought. Let us have faith that right makes might and in that faith let us to the end, dare to do our duty as we understand it." Freedom diminishes as new laws are necessary to control those who will not control themselves. We must remember that freedom under law begins with self government.

My wish for the people of the United States is to be deserving of the choicest blessings from Heaven. If we remember and renew (1) Our belief in God, (2) The proper role of government, and (3) The true meaning of freedom under law - then America will continue to be a recipient of the choicest blessings of Heaven. We will continue to live in peace and prosperity, grow in numbers, wealth, and power like no other nation on earth.
