7	provisions allowing a person authorized to carry a concealed firearm in another state to
8	carry a concealed firearm in this state.

13	Section 1. Section <b>76-10-523</b> is amended to read:

16	of the following:
17	(a) a United States marshal [while engaged in the performance of his official duties];
18	(b) a federal official required to carry a firearm [while engaged in the performance of his
19	official duties];
20	(c) a peace officer of this or any other jurisdiction [while engaged in the performance of
21	his official duties];
22	(d) a law enforcement official as defined and qualified under Section 53-5-711;
23	(e) a judge as defined and qualified in Section 53-5-711;
24	(f) a common carrier while engaged in the regular and ordinary transport of firearms as
25	merchandise: or



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26	(g) a nonresident traveling in or through the state, provided that any firearm is:
27	(i) unloaded; and
28	(ii) securely encased as defined in Section 76-10-501.
29	(2) The provisions of Subsections 76-10-504(1)(a), (1)(b), and Section 76-10-505 do not
30	apply to any person to whom a permit to carry a concealed firearm has been issued:
31	(a) pursuant to Section 53-5-704; or
32	[(b) by another state whose requirements for issuance of a concealed firearm permit have
33	been determined annually by the Department of Public Safety to meet or exceed the requirements
34	for issuance of a concealed firearm permit in this state.]
