154 Section 1. Section **10-2-117** is amended to read:

155 **10-2-117. Notification to lieutenant governor of election of city officers.**

156 Within ten days of the canvass of the final election of city officers under Section 10-2-116,  
157 the county clerk shall send written notice to the [~~lieutenant governor~~] State Elections Commission  
158 of the name and position of each officer elected and the term for which each has been elected.

159 Section 2. Section **17-2-2** is amended to read:

160 **17-2-2. Election returns transmitted to lieutenant governor.**

161 As soon as the returns of the vote upon such proposition have been canvassed by the county  
162 boards of canvassers each county clerk must make a certified abstract thereof, seal up such  
163 abstract, endorse it "election returns," and without delay transmit it by registered mail to the  
164 [~~lieutenant governor~~] State Elections Commission.

165 Section 3. Section **17-2-3** is amended to read:

166 **17-2-3. Certification of election result to governor.**

167 The certified abstract of such returns must be filed [~~in the office of the lieutenant governor~~]  
168 with the State Elections Commission, and, if it appears therefrom that a majority of the voters in  
169 each of the counties have voted in favor of such annexation, the lieutenant governor must certify  
170 the result of such vote to the governor.

173 As soon as the returns of the vote upon the proposition under either Subsection 17-2-6(1)  
174 or 17-2-6(2) have been canvassed by the county boards of canvassers, each county clerk must make  
175 a certified abstract thereof, endorse it "election returns," and without delay transmit it by registered  
176 mail to the [~~lieutenant governor~~] State Elections Commission.

177 Section 5. Section **17-2-8** is amended to read:

178 **17-2-8. Certification of election result to governor.**

179 (1) The certified abstract of such returns shall be filed [~~in the office of the lieutenant~~  
180 ~~governor~~] with the State Elections Commission.

181 (2) (a) In an election held under Subsection 17-2-6(1), if it appears from the certified  
182 abstract that a majority of those voting in each county have voted in favor of such annexation, the

183 [~~lieutenant governor~~] State Elections Commission shall certify the result of such vote to the  
184 governor.

185 (b) In an election held under Subsection 17-2-6(2), the [~~lieutenant governor~~] State  
186 Elections Commission shall certify the result of that vote to the governor if it appears from the  
187 certified abstract that:

188 (i) a majority of voters living in the area proposed for annexation have voted in favor of  
189 annexation; and

190 (ii) a majority of voters living in the county to which the area is proposed to be annexed  
191 have voted in favor of annexation.

194 As soon as the returns of the vote upon such proposition have been canvassed by the county

196 endorse it "election returns," and without delay transmit it, together with a certified copy of the  
197 petition provided for in Section 17-3-1 by registered mail to the [~~lieutenant governor~~] State  
198 Elections Commission.

199 Section 7. Section **17-16-6.5** is amended to read:

200 **17-16-6.5. Campaign financial disclosure in county elections.**

201 (1) (a) By January 1, 1996, each county shall adopt an ordinance establishing campaign  
202 finance disclosure requirements for candidates for county office.

203 (b) The ordinance shall include:

204 (i) a requirement that each candidate for county office report his itemized and total  
205 campaign contributions and expenditures at least once within the two weeks before the election  
206 and at least once within two months after the election;

207 (ii) a definition of "contribution" and "expenditure" that requires reporting of nonmonetary  
208 contributions such as in-kind contributions and contributions of tangible things; and

209 (iii) a requirement that the financial reports identify:

210 (A) for each contribution of more than \$50, the name of the donor of the contribution and  
211 the amount of the contribution; and

212 (B) for each expenditure, the name of the recipient and the amount of the expenditure.

213 (2) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (2)(b), if any county fails to adopt a campaign

214 finance disclosure ordinance by January 1, 1996, candidates for county office shall comply with  
215 the financial reporting requirements contained in Subsections (3) through (6).

216 (b) If, after August 1, 1995, any county adopts a campaign finance ordinance meeting the  
217 requirements of Subsection (1), that county need not comply with the requirements of Subsections  
218 (3) through (6).

219 (3) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (3)(b), and if there is no county ordinance meeting  
220 the requirements of this section, each candidate for elective office in any county who is not  
221 required to submit a campaign financial statement to the [~~lieutenant governor~~] State Elections  
222 Commission shall file a signed campaign financial statement with the county clerk:

223 (i) seven days before the date of the regular general election, reporting each contribution  
224 of more than \$50 and each expenditure as of ten days before the date of the regular general  
225 election; and

226 (ii) no later than 30 days after the date of the regular general election.

227 (b) Candidates for community council offices are exempt from the requirements of this  
228 section.

229 (4) (a) The statement filed seven days before the regular general election shall include:

230 (i) a list of each contribution of more than \$50 received by the candidate, and the name of  
231 the donor;

232 (ii) an aggregate total of all contributions of \$50 or less received by the candidate; and

233 (iii) a list of each expenditure for political purposes made during the campaign period, and  
234 the recipient of each expenditure.

235 (b) The statement filed 30 days after the regular general election shall include:

236 (i) a list of each contribution of more than \$50 received after the cutoff date for the  
237 statement filed seven days before the election, and the name of the donor;

238 (ii) an aggregate total of all contributions of \$50 or less received by the candidate after the  
239 cutoff date for the statement filed seven days before the election; and

240 (iii) a list of all expenditures for political purposes made by the candidate after the cutoff  
241 date for the statement filed seven days before the election, and the recipient of each expenditure.

242 (5) Candidates for elective office in any county who are eliminated at a primary election  
243 shall file a signed campaign financial statement containing the information required by this section  
244 not later than 30 days after the primary election.

245 (6) Any person who fails to comply with this section is guilty of an infraction.

246 (7) Counties may, by ordinance, enact requirements that:

247 (a) require greater disclosure of campaign contributions and expenditures; and

248 (b) impose additional penalties.

249 Section 8. Section **17-20-5** is amended to read:

250 **17-20-5. Report of election and appointment of officers.**

251 Within ten days after a county clerk issues a certificate of election or a certificate of  
252 appointment made to fill vacancies in elective county offices, the county clerk shall prepare and

253 forward to the [~~lieutenant governor~~] State Elections Commission a certified report showing:

254 (1) the name of the county;

255 (2) the name of the county office to which the person was elected or appointed;

256 (3) the date of the election or appointment of the person;

257 (4) the date of the expiration of the term for which the person was elected or appointed;

258 (5) the date of the certificate of election or appointment; and

259 (6) the date of the qualification of the person elected or appointed.

260 Section 9. Section **20A-1-102** is amended to read:

261 **20A-1-102. Definitions.**

262 As used in this title:

263 (1) "Active voter" means a registered voter who has not been classified as an inactive voter  
264 by the county clerk.

265 (2) "Automatic tabulating equipment" means apparatus that automatically examines and  
266 counts votes recorded on paper ballots or ballot cards and tabulates the results.

267 (3) "Ballot" means the cardboard, paper, or other material upon which a voter records his  
268 votes and includes ballot cards, paper ballots, and secrecy envelopes.

269 (4) "Ballot card" means a ballot that can be counted using automatic tabulating equipment.

270 (5) "Ballot label" means the cards, papers, booklet, pages, or other materials that contain  
271 the names of offices and candidates and statements of ballot propositions to be voted on and which  
272 are used in conjunction with ballot cards.

273 (6) "Ballot proposition" means opinion questions specifically authorized by the  
274 Legislature, constitutional amendments, initiatives, referenda, and judicial retention questions that  
275 are submitted to the voters for their approval or rejection.

276 (7) "Board of canvassers" means the entities established by Sections 20A-4-301 and  
277 20A-4-306 to canvass election returns.

278 (8) "Bond election" means an election held for the sole purpose of approving or rejecting  
279 the proposed issuance of bonds by a government entity.

280 (9) "Book voter registration form" means voter registration forms contained in a bound  
281 book that are used by election officers and registration agents to register persons to vote.

282 (10) "By-mail voter registration form" means a voter registration form designed to be  
283 completed by the voter and mailed to the election officer.

284 (11) "Canvass" means the review of election returns and the official declaration of election  
285 results by the board of canvassers.

286 (12) "Canvassing judge" means an election judge designated to assist in counting ballots  
287 at the canvass.

288 (13) "Convention" means the political party convention at which party officers and  
289 delegates are selected.

290 (14) "Counting center" means one or more locations selected by the election officer in  
291 charge of the election for the automatic counting of ballots.

292 (15) "Counting judge" means a judge designated to count the ballots during election day.

293 (16) "Counting poll watcher" means a person selected as provided in Section 20A-3-201  
294 to witness the counting of ballots.

295 (17) "Counting room" means a suitable and convenient private place or room, immediately  
296 adjoining the place where the election is being held, for use by the counting judges to count ballots  
297 during election day.

298 (18) "County executive" means:

299 (a) the county commission in the county commission or expanded county commission  
300 form of government established under Title 17, Chapter 52, Forms of County Government;

301 (b) the county executive in the county executive and chief administrative officer-council  
302 optional form of government authorized by Section 17-52-503;

303 (c) the county executive in the county executive-council optional form of government  
304 authorized by Section 17-52-504;

305 (d) the county council in the council-manager optional form of government authorized by  
306 Section 17-52-505; and

307 (e) the county council in the council-county administrative officer optional form of  
308 government authorized by Section 17-52-506.

309 (19) "County legislative body" means:

310 (a) the county commission in the county commission or expanded county commission  
311 form of government established under Title 17, Chapter 52, Forms of County Government;

312 (b) the county council in the county executive and chief administrative officer-council  
313 optional form of government authorized by Section 17-52-503;

314 (c) the county council in the county executive-council optional form of government  
315 authorized by Section 17-52-504;

316 (d) the county council in the council-manager optional form of government authorized by  
317 Section 17-52-505; and

318 (e) the county council in the council-county administrative officer optional form of  
319 government authorized by Section 17-52-506.

320 (20) "County officers" means those county officers that are required by law to be elected.

321 (21) "Election" means a regular general election, a municipal general election, a statewide  
322 special election, a local special election, a regular primary election, a municipal primary election,  
323 and a special district election.

324 (22) "Election cycle" means the period beginning on the first day persons are eligible to  
325 file declarations of candidacy and ending when the canvass is completed.

326 (23) "Election judge" means each canvassing judge, counting judge, and receiving judge.

327 (24) "Election officer" means:

328 (a) the ~~[lieutenant governor]~~ executive director of the State Elections Commission, for all  
329 statewide ballots;

330 (b) the county clerk or clerks for all county ballots and for certain special district and  
331 school district ballots as provided in Section 20A-5-400.5;

332 (c) the municipal clerk for all municipal ballots and for certain special district and school  
333 district ballots as provided in Section 20A-5-400.5; and

334 (d) the special district clerk or chief executive officer for all special district ballots that are  
335 not part of a statewide, county, or municipal ballot.

336 (25) "Election official" means any election officer, election judge, or satellite registrar.

337 (26) "Election returns" includes the pollbook, all affidavits of registration, the military and

338 overseas absentee voter registration and voting certificates, one of the tally sheets, any unprocessed  
339 absentee ballots, all counted ballots, all excess ballots, all unused ballots, all spoiled ballots, the  
340 ballot disposition form, and the total votes cast form.

341 (27) "Electronic voting system" means a system in which a voting device is used in  
342 conjunction with ballots so that votes recorded by the voter are counted and tabulated by automatic  
343 tabulating equipment.

344 (28) "Inactive voter" means a registered voter who has been sent the notice required by  
345 Section 20A-2-306 and who has failed to respond to that notice.

346 (29) "Inspecting poll watcher" means a person selected as provided in this title to witness  
347 the receipt and safe deposit of voted and counted ballots.

348 (30) "Judicial office" means the office filled by any judicial officer.

349 (31) "Judicial officer" means any justice or judge of a court of record or any county court  
350 judge.

351 (32) "Local election" means a regular municipal election, a local special election, a special  
352 district election, and a bond election.

353 (33) "Local political subdivision" means a county, a municipality, a special district, or a  
354 local school district.

355 (34) "Local special election" means a special election called by the governing body of a

362 (c) the manager in the council-manager optional form of government defined in Section

364 (36) "Municipal general election" means the election held in municipalities and special  
365 districts on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each odd-numbered year for  
366 the purposes established in Section 20A-1-202.

367 (37) "Municipal legislative body" means:

368 (a) the city commission, city council, or town council in the traditional management

369 arrangement established by Title 10, Chapter 3, Part 1, Governing Body;

370 (b) the municipal council in the council-mayor optional form of government defined in  
371 Section 10-3-1209; and

372 (c) the municipal council in the council-manager optional form of government defined in

374 (38) "Municipal officers" means those municipal officers that are required by law to be  
375 elected.

376 (39) "Municipal primary election" means an election held to nominate candidates for

378 (40) "Official ballot" means the ballots distributed by the election officer to the election  
379 judges to be given to voters to record their votes.

380 (41) "Official endorsement" means:

381 (a) the information on the ballot that identifies:

382 (i) the ballot as an official ballot;

384 (iii) the facsimile signature of the election officer; and
